Ever since opening on Allport Lane, Bromborough, in November 2021, Pina Loca has received countless 5 star reviews. We checked it out one Wednesday evening to discover what all the fuss is about....



What's Pina Loca about?

Pina Loca is not your typical Mexican with the standard quesadillas, burritos and tacos. Instead, at Pina Loca you'll find colourful, flavoursome and creative dishes in a sumptuously decorated restaurant — all Mexican themed and with their own unique twist. With a super cool soundtrack, its relaxed open plan style get you feeling good as soon as you walk in.

Pina Loca is the brainchild of Babul Miah — a man with years of experience working for top restaurant brands such as Karma and Mowgli. His new concept, subject to an incredible refit (it used to be a newsagents) is going down a storm and is open 7 days a week. Oh — and an intimate new cocktail bar is coming soon upstairs!

What's on the menu?

Pina Loca has a refined menu featuring mouth watering Mexican dishes — from small plates and tacos to bowls and burritos — all with their own intriguing twist. It's a beautiful cross between relaxed, fun dining and high end, top quality cuisine in a stylish yet not snobby environment. If you're after a bargain they do 3 small plates for £12 12pm-4pm every day and if you're after a bevvy their tequila and cocktails range is banging!



Our visit

We visited on a Wednesday evening to sample a bit of everything they offer. We started with their signature nachos, unique in their own way, before moving on to small plates and tacos. We opted for 5 small plates of pina wings, blackened jalapenos, avocado salad, pea tostada and elote and 2 baja fish and calabaza tacos. A spiced Strawberry Margarita was the perfect way to finish.

We love to try places out before recommending them, even if they already have many 5 star Facebook and Trip Advisor reviews, and we can honestly say Pina Loca did not disappoint one bit. We arrived at 5pm, loving the boss soundtrack, great environment and top notch food, and the place was full by 7pm on a Wednesday night — it's hardly a surprise to be fair.

A Liverpool chef has been shortlisted for Chef Of The Year at the British Kebab Awards. Turkish Masterchef Kemal Coskuncay has been recognised as one of the 10 best kebab chefs in the country and will travel to London on 28th February to take part in the prestigious awards ceremony.



The British Kebab Awards is now in its 11th year and attracts a host of celebrities, prominent politicians, journalists and most importantly the nation's hard-working restaurant workers for an evening of celebration. The kebab industry is worth over £2.2 billion to the UK economy and the awards are sponsored by Just Eat. Turkish Masterchef Kemal Coskuncay is based in South Liverpool and is the owner of Private Delicacies — a private dining



and consultation company. Masterchef Kemal works with some of Liverpool's top restaurants including Al Dente on Lark Lane — a restaurant that has consistently been in the Top 10 restaurants in Liverpool on Trip Advisor.

Whether it be kebabs, tomahawk steaks or seafood dishes, I use only the finest ingredients. I am very passionate both as a chef and restaurant consultant and it feels great to be recognised by the British Kebab Awards for my work."



When you speak about bands from Liverpool who have reached global stardom, 'The Beatles' is naturally the auto-response. However, for the past 23 years Ladytron have been quietly going about their own global domination of the electro-pop scene — with an eye-watering portfolio of achievements — and they return to Liverpool at Camp & Furnace on 11th March 2023.

Formed in Liverpool in 1999, the alternative fab four consists of local lads Daniel Hunt and Reuben Wu alongside the enigmatic Helen Marnie and Mira Aroyo. During their reign as one of the most influential electro-pop outfits of all time, they have collaborated with the likes of Christina Aguilera, Placebo, Blondie, Bloc Party and Nine Inch Nails, to name a few.



Industry respect for Ladytron is huge and their six albums have been met with critical acclaim, meanwhile they have performed at Coachella, Creamfields and Sydney Opera House and alongside the likes of Bjork and Goldfrapp.

Despite the foursome all living in different parts of the world, they are showing no signs of slowing down with their new album release and forthcoming tour.

Time's Arrow is Ladytron's 7th studio album,

launching in January 2023, and rather aptly it will be showcased in Liverpool alongside some of their greatest hits on 11th March at Camp & Furnace.



A true homecoming if ever there was one, the huge Liverpool gig is being hosted by Evol — the legendary local events promoters that Daniel Hunt and Rueben Wu helped start 20 years ago.

Courtesy of Evol's main man, Revo Ziganda, we enjoyed a quickfire Q & A with Daniel Hunt prior to the March homecoming show to talk about Ladytron's epic history spanning four decades.

Here's our interview with him and all you need to know about the huge gig at Camp & Furnace....

LVL: So, Daniel, first of all how are you and how's life living in Brazil?

DANIEL: Right now I'm back in Liverpool for Christmas. The good things about Brazil are always there, regardless of problems that exist anywhere. For a foreigner it is an easy place to live well if you know how. Many don't figure it out. The atmosphere there is obviously far better since the election. There is finally hope for the future now after a very dark period. Brazil is back.

LVL: What's 2022 been like for Ladytron?

What have you guys been up to?

DANIEL: We have been preparing for this album release all year. Also we celebrated 20 years of our second album, Light & Magic, in the summer which held a lot of memories.

LVL: Tell us about this new album then — what can people expect if they haven't already listened to it?

DANIEL: It might be our best. I won't know until it is out. Music sounds different once others have heard it.

LVL: It must feel great playing back in Liverpool again! When was the last time and how do you feel about this homecoming?



DANIEL: This will only be our third Liverpool show in 15 years, I think. We last played in 2018, after a long break. I'm excited of course. It is emotional to come back and play in my city after being away so long.

LVL: What can we expect from this mega homecoming and new album gig?

DANIEL: We are beginning to put it all together now. The hits, of course. But we want to try some new approaches this time around, aside from a few new songs, also some we have not played live for a long time, or ever. But we are thinking about the show as a whole, working again with video artist, long time friend and collaborator Sam Whiel.

LVL: Obviously local promoters Evol are putting this on and I understand you were an integral part of starting Evol with Revo some 20 years or so ago. How do you feel the music industry changed during that time?

DANIEL: Yes we started Evol with Revo in 2003 after getting back off tour for our second album and wanting something to keep us occupied.

He developed it from that party, via our involvement in Korova, into a big independent promoter of shows and festivals. Very proud of what he has achieved with it.

The industry has changed massively. We saw the very end of the old order when we first began, an intermediate phase which was then assumed to permanent, and how things are now. There are positives and negatives in such changes, of course, but it is just a case of adapting to them.

LVL: What have been your most memorable moments and gigs over the past 23 years of Ladytron?

DANIEL: Some shows certainly stand out. Sydney Opera House, Bogota, Coachella.

LVL: What are the plans for the future after this big Liverpool homecoming?

DANIEL: We will be playing a few dates in the US in May. The record is going well so more shows elsewhere in the world I guess.

A work of art, a masterpiece, a dream — call it what you will, Neil Campbell's latest creation, Faldum, is simply stunning! The Liverpool composer has excelled himself once again with a beautifully poignant and equally powerful new album oozing with strings and symphonies. Goosebumps springs to mind.



The new nine track album (including the bonus track) has been almost three years in the making, following on from last year's critically acclaimed The Great Escape. Indeed, it's clear to see why the album has been so long in the making — with layer upon layer of orchestral beauty. Buckle up and be prepared for an emotional, heartstring pulling ride.

In addition to being an extremely talented guitar maestro and a favourite of BBC Radio 6 Music, Neil Campbell is an ingenious composer of the highest calibre and Faldum states that emphatically. Heavily constructed and painstakingly curated, this most excellent masterpiece brings music back to what it should be — an art form that touches the depths of the soul.

Faldum is based on Herman Hesse's profound 1916 fairytale of the same name, set in a Swiss town where wishes are granted and chaos ensues — with a young

violinist as the centre of the story wishing to play the most beautiful music. Aptly so, Campbell's new album does exactly that and the first 10 minute track, Overture, sets the scene for an awe-inspiring journey.



Akin to Requiem For A Dream, Overture is a symphony of strings put together so masterfully — gripping the listener from the outset. An exquisite and dramatic work of art that mesmerises and captivates with every single sound — it wouldn't be out of place in a multi-award winning movie. Awards are certainly deserved for this beautiful piece alone.

The eight tracks that follow all flow and fall into each other effortlessly, taking the listener on a spine-tingling trip of ultimate escapism. The second track, Faldum One, brings drums (courtesy of Jon Lawton's expert programming) and electric guitar (courtesy of Neil Campbell, of course) into the mix and paired with the many layers of strings it makes for a fascinating remainder of the album.

As we traverse through Faldum Two, Three, Four, Five and Six, we experience a multitude of emotions and very deep, sensual and soft harmonies — and almost folk-like at times, spooky and haunting at others. We finish on The Mountain — a soft and poignant 16 minute delight that seems to fall back magnificently into the initial Overture track — and then finally the chimey and playful bonus track, The Wish.



If you're a lover of music as an art form and appreciate the finer things rather than the computerised, talentless trash that's spewed out of the mainstream system, then please do listen to this. Faldum is what music should be — something created meticulously and masterfully and to be enjoyed like a fine whisky or vintage wine.



Bravo, Neil, you've outdone yourself again! Huge applause for your top level production alongside Jon Lawton of Crosstown Studios and to the two incredibly talented string musicians you have collaborated with on this — Amy Chambers (violins) and Nicole Collarbone (cellos). Awards now, please, for all involved in this spellbinding creation. No superlatives can truly do this album justice — simply stunning.



In this La Vida Liverpool exclusive we take you on an intergalactic journey through the history of Space — the iconic Scouse band who experienced a meteoric rise to fame in the 90s. With hits such as Neighbourhood and Female Of The Species, they cemented themselves as one of the most successful Scouse bands of all time.



Following the huge success of their first two albums, Spiders and Tin Planet, it's been a rollercoaster ride these past 20 years or so, but Space are BACK with a BIG BANG! Here we chat to Tommy and Phil about the history of Space and their new lease of life with their new album, Music For Pleasure Music For Pain, and a forthcoming UK tour of Spiders and Tin Planet!

LVL: First of all guys, what's going on with Space at the moment? It seems you've been pretty busy?



TOMMY: We've been gigging loads and I just love playing gigs! We've just released our latest album, Music For Pleasure Music

For Pain, and that's signed to Hug Records that our manager Mark runs with his eldest Jorgie. We've also nearly finished recording our next album too so yeah we've been pretty busy.

PHIL: Yeah, we always get restless when we don't play so we like to play as many gigs as possible and Tommy never stops writing. From 24th February we'll be doing some anniversary gigs as part of a UK Tour where we play the Spiders and Tin Planet albums in one gig. The Liverpool gig is at the O2 Academy on 1st April.

LVL: So, what's the new album all about for those who haven't heard it yet?

TOMMY: It's a real mix of genres. It's got hip hop influences, bits of punk, queasy listening, Sinatra vibes, some James Bond style stuff. Some Beastie Boys influence. Some of it is deep and dark and some observational about real life stuff.



LVL: Ok, so taking it right back, what was it like in the early days there back in the 90s and how did you get your big break?

TOMMY: We were originally The Australians and when that broke up we became Space and just played everywhere locally — places like The Pickett. Our manager Mark first saw us as The Australians but we were

unmanageable then, fighting on stage and stuff, but when he came back and saw us as Space he took us on. The rest is history.



LVL: You guys experienced a meteoric rise to fame. Do you think it's difficult for Scouse bands always being compared to The Beatles and what advice would you give to young up and coming local bands trying to break through?

TOMMY: What can you say about The Beatles that hasn't already been said? They were amazing obviously but they've become more of a tourist attraction. No-ones ever going to get as big as that so there's no point trying to do it.

PHIL: Yeah I agree. My best advice to bands is do is do your own thing and never give up. Don't try to jump on the bandwagon and if you love what you produce someone else will too.



LVL: How do you deal with a rise to fame like that and it must be a lot of pressure following up a debut album that does so well?

TOMMY: It was mad you know. The furthest I'd been was North Wales in a caravan and the next thing we're gigging internationally, on Top Of The Pops, meeting Tom Jones and Mike Myers. It's true that it was tough being pressured to write another Female Of The Species when everything I do is organic and a one off but fortunately

we had some more big hits and Tin Planet was a big follow up album to Spiders.

LVL: There's a question I've always wanted to ask Tommy. That big hit Neighbourhood from the debut Spiders album — was that about your childhood growing up in Liverpool?

TOMMY: Obviously there wasn't a serial killer, for example, but there was someone I thought was a serial killer. I used to think the vicar was a bit dodgy. Basically, it's about my imagination — watching what's going on. Even in school I'd daydream looking out the window and using my imagination. One of my favourite bands is The Kinks and I love storytelling in music.

LVL: I've been a massive fan of Space from the age of 10 so I feel a little starstruck interviewing you guys. Were there any moments at festivals etc. where you felt like that?

PHIL: The biggest one for me was Iggy Pop. We were in Rome once and I got to go around The Vatican with Iggy Pop — it was odd! My wife was ripping him and he was dead sound! It was a strange experience but it wouldn't have happened without the band!



LVL: You must have some crazy stories from over the years!

PHIL: I was a bass guitarist originally before becoming the drummer so I've seen it all! There are too many to tell but one of my favourites was at a festival when Jamie came out in a towel and Marilyn Manson appeared. Jamie was ginger so Marilyn Manson was like 'I'm ginger too' and exposed himself to us all then chased Jamie. He was wearing big platform shoes and it was mad to watch!



LVL: Are there any gigs that stand out over the years?

PHIL: When we were The Drellas we played the closing down gig at Quiggin's in Liverpool and it went off its head! It was a mad night with a lot of Liverpool bands including punk band the SS and everyone trashed the gaff as it was getting torn apart by developers anyway. It was mental! Obviously playing V Festival and Glastonbury was amazing!



TOMMY: For me playing at Anfield for a Hillsborough Memorial gig was very special. All different football fans united together for one thing.

LVL: So you guys split up then came back together. What was it that brought the band together again?



TOMMY: Our drummer Andy left the band as he didn't seem interested in all the success — he just wanted to play for the

love of it. He was the loveliest fella in the world and when he passed away in 2009 we all met up at the funeral. We all went to the pub afterwards and talked about getting back together again in his name, which we did in 2011.



LVL: So fast forward again today with so much going on — I guess this is somewhat a renaissance for Space?

TOMMY: Yeah definitely — we've got more energy now playing live and we're more crazy than ever. The new album is doing great and 2023 will be a big year. We're especially looking forward to the Space and Tin Planet tour — that'll be a lot of fun!





A new ground-breaking first of its kind additional needs hub is opening in Birkenhead. Social Living Organisation BNR Agency are completely self-funding the centre — a unique space that will bridge the gap and offer opportunities to children and adults with disabilities like never before.



BNR Hub is opening on Brandon Street later this year and will offer a safe space for those with additional, complex and challenging needs. The idea is to create a space where the people they care for, as well as people in the care of other agencies and organizations, can enjoy things they wouldn't usually get the chance to.

BNR Agency works with adults who have complex and challenging needs — prohibiting them from many activities. The new hub will offer activities such as art therapy, drama classes, holistic therapies, cookery classes, kitchen takeovers and dining experiences, music workshops, live entertainment, social events and more to people who wouldn't usually be able to experience them.

BNR Founder and Director Hildah Munikwa

said: "We care for adults who have a variety of complex and challenging and needs. We provide social living environments for them, with 24/7 care, to help them live independently however there are still many things that some of them cannot do — for example, going out for a meal with family or going to a live music event."

She continued: "As much as we provide them with a better quality of life and the very best safety and care, many of the things that we take for granted are unobtainable for them. They can react very badly to crowds or other triggers and it's so very sad. We've decided to create BNR Hub to bridge this gap by having a safe space where the things that they want can be brought to them — making the impossible possible."



A place where the unachievable is achievable, BNR Hub will feature a kitchen, social area, specialist toilets and wet rooms, events spaces and multi-sensory spaces — operating on a booking system for their own service users and external organizations. The idea is to make it adaptable where it can be tailored to a variety of people with many different complex needs.

Co-Director Stefan Brunt said: "Every person is different and requires different environments to ensure they don't get triggered or have bad reactions. We therefore have to be on top of risk assessments with everything we do. This is vital but also limiting — meaning some of them can't have days out or things we take for granted. The Hub aims to change that by offering a space that brings experiences to them."



BNR Hub will be collaborating with external companies and facilitators to provide experiences to people who wouldn't usually be able to enjoy them. From restaurants providing dining experiences to musicians providing workshops and entertainment to holistic therapists providing treatments, there'll be an abundance of activities delivered in a safe environment.

Centre Manager Leighton Stewart said: "BNR Hub is ground breaking in that it will provide so many more opportunities to people — not just the people in our care but people in the care of other agencies and other organisations. We're very proud to be self-funding this new facility and hope that it can be rolled out nationwide — it's going to change many lives!"

BNR Agency was founded in 2014 by Hildah Munikwa and currently employs over 100 staff — using all their own staff at all times and consistently having top CQC ratings.



The organization provide high levels of training to all its employees and has self-funded the hub in order to remain in control and keep standards high.

Hildah explained: "We're very proud of the high standards of care and service we provide and we are very knowledgeable about what we do from bespoke care packages to high level risk assessments. We've created a dream with BNR Hub where the impossible is possible and the unachievable is achievable and we want to remain in control of that. That's why we've self-funded it — we know that it's in good hands with us."

The Hub is opening 13th March 2023 on Brandon Street in Birkenhead — offering experiences and opportunities to people with additional, complex and challenging needs.

Two former Special Forces soldiers from Liverpool have pledged over £360,000 of their own money and over 5,000 hours of their time to help their fellow veterans. Peter McCombe and Colin Eastaway, who both served in Iraq and Afghanistan, founded The Block CIC in November 2020 and have helped over 250 veterans despite no official funding.



The Block CIC is a veterans outreach organisation based in Kirkdale that bridges the gap and offers a wide range of support services to ex-servicemen and women. Ran by Peter, Colin and a small team of volunteers, The Block offers emergency accommodation, emotional support, coffee mornings, drop ins, signposting, workshops, courses, retreats and more.

Peter and Colin met in a careers office in 2000 and went on to serve together in Iraq and Afghanistan, both losing friends and suffering from PTSD as a result. After Peter was discharged due to a brain injury during combat and becoming disillusioned with the lack of support, he invested his military compensation into creating The Block — with Colin soon joining forces with his old friend.



During the past two years, without any official funding, Peter, Colin and the team have literally saved lives — helping veterans in times of crisis, getting them off the streets and providing a safe haven and refuge for them. Ploughing all their money into the building and running costs and investing countless hours into the project, they have dedicated their lives to the cause.



Colin explained: "The Block really is a 24/7 service and we have gone out to veterans in times of crisis at any given time. My partner will tell you — many dinners have been abandoned because we have gone out on a call and we've been out at all times of day and night."

One recent success story is Leon who had major alcohol problems and was living in a tent in woods with his two dogs. Colin and the team went to pick him up, gave him a mental health assessment and provided him with accommodation, a phone, clothing, food and support — he is now doing well, with a good job and his own property in the affluent area of Formby.

Leon said: "Since leaving the military I was diagnosed with PTSD and went through a stage of drinking every day. I lost everything and this led to me living in the woods with my two dogs. I recently met The Block's Patron, Johnny Mercer, and told him I'd be

dead if it wasn't for The Block. This small organisation have turned my life around so please anyone, just show your support to The Block."



Another veteran, Lee, said: "I was suffering with PTSD and when my relationship broke down I became homeless — living in my car and feeling too ashamed to reach out to friends and family. I received a little support from the council and charities but it all seemed very long winded and I needed more — I needed a roof over my head and hope."

Yet, despite the heroic efforts of Peter, Colin and the team, The Block CIC has still not had any official funding — instead investing their own money and being reliant upon donations from the public. One such donor is Sharon and the team from Adam Somes Elite Training and Total Integrated Solutions who have raised over £20,000 for the project in memory of Sharon's son Andy — a veteran who tragically took his own life due to PTSD in 2021.

Money donated by Sharon has been vital to keep the project alive whilst funders have viewed the project as too young to invest in. In 2022, Sharon's fundraising efforts fully funded one of the holistic therapy retreats that was backed by doctors at Liverpool University — with 100% positive results and 10 out of 10 veterans stating they'd recommend mindfulness to other veterans struggling with mental health.

Colin said: "We're so grateful to those who have supported us so far. It is frustrating not receiving funding but we're getting there. I work full time and my partner works part time, whilst Peter has serious medical issues following his time serving, and although the volunteers do a truly fantastic job, we really need funding to be able to employ full time staff here."

A recent ONS report showed that there are over 50,000 veterans residing in the North West of England. A recent British Journal of Psychiatry report highlighted that veterans are much more likely to develop PTSD than non-veterans and of those who have served in conflict, 17% reported symptoms of PTSD and 30% were predicted to develop a mental health condition. Meanwhile, NHS mental health waiting lists are over 12 months long.

The Block CIC needs funding in order to employ a full time member of staff, therefore enabling the project to do more outreach work and help more veterans. They would also like funding in order to develop more mental health and wellbeing workshops, courses and retreats — something that local veterans have asked for more of in a local survey carried out by The Block.



Colin summarised: "Peter and I have put in everything to this project — from the building to the refurb to the running costs and we are eternally grateful to the volunteers and public sponsors who have helped and donated. We're ready to go to the next level now though and in order to maximise our potential and we need investment from funders. We have countless testimonials from veterans, it's time to support us."

A 17-year-old from Birkenhead has overcome agoraphobia and social anxiety to become a successful young business owner. Up until the age of 15, Joshua Morgan would stay in his room alone most of the time and had few friends, until volunteer work at his local community centre led him to set up his own mobile DJ and child entertainment business.



Joshua now owns Wirral Disco Hire & Entertainments — holding a regular residency at The Queens Hotel in Birkenhead — and has a top DJ set up for parties. He also offers children's parties, with a fun disco and entertainment package, and although he is becoming very successful — this is something that was unimaginable a couple of years ago.

Joshua explained: "Until only a couple of years ago I was in a very dark place and I was stuck in a rut. All I'd do was stay in my room, play computer games and listen to music because I was very self conscious and worried what people would think of me. I'd never go out because I had anxiety that people were talking about me. I had no life really."

Joshua's agoraphobia and social anxiety grew worse and with the future looking bleak the pandemic hit — with isolation and restrictions expected to worsen Joshua's condition furthermore. His parents became very concerned and having tried everything they could, his father one day convinced him to come to the social supermarket at Building Bridges Community Centre.

Joshua's father, Billy, said: "Our Josh is such a lovely, nice natured and talented lad and it was so frustrating to see him staying in all the time doing nothing with his life. I've been involved in Building Bridges and it really is a fantastic service with great people — offering support to people in the community — so I thought bringing Josh along would help build his confidence."



Joshua's father convincing him to go along that day proved to be a decision that would change his life forever. Billy introduced him to the social supermarket and the project — including the children's summer holiday club and various activities and clubs. Building Bridges owner, Michelle Bridge, gave Joshua lots of attention and encouraged him to get involved in the project.

Michelle said: "Josh was such a quiet and shy lad — nervous and unsure of himself. I knew Billy was concerned about him so I really wanted to help Josh overcome his anxieties. I gave him lots of attention, spent time with him and after a little while asked him to help out with some of the things here — starting with odd jobs and things that needed fixing. The rest, as they say, is history."

Joshua went from strength to strength at Building Bridges and eventually got involved in the children's summer holiday club. It transpired that Joshua was a natural entertainer and became a big hit with the younger children — playing fun games with them, dancing and showing them all the music he'd discovered spending hour after hour in his room.

Slowly but surely, Joshua came into his own and decided to pursue his passion for music and entertaining. He gained some experience working for a local disco hire company and in June 2021 he set up his own company — Wirral Disco Hire & Entertainments — that offers a full DJ service for events and functions and also a children's party service.



Since setting up in June 2021, Joshua's business has gone from strength to strength. After some initial investment, he now has a full sound and lighting set up, a booth, karaoke, a smoke machine, a popcorn and candyfloss machine, toys, games and more. Having entertained at many birthdays, weddings, engagement parties and other special occasions, he has become very highly rated — with many satisfied customers.

Speaking of his new found confidence, Joshua said: "I'm a completely different person now to what I was up to the age of 15. I knew I had talent and had a brain but I had no motivation — the social anxiety and insecurities took over me. I am so happy that my Dad convinced me to go to Building Bridges that day and I'm so grateful to Michelle for giving me her time, love and the opportunity to get involved there."

Joshua offers a DJ and children's entertainment service at weekends — whilst in the week he is at Wirral Metropolitan College studying Electrical Installations. He is currently learning to drive — something that will help him get to venues to DJ rather than relying on friends and family to transport him around.



Joshua summarised: "I'm studying hard in college and would like to one day have my own electrical company but with the way the DJing and entertainment business is going who knows — I could end up doing both. I enjoy making people happy and getting them up dancing — making people's special occasions memorable. I love the kids parties too and helping the shy kids get up as I know what it was like when I had no confidence."

A first of its kind community pub has opened in Wallasey, Wirral. Merseyside Woman Of The Year 2020, Michelle Leatham, has fused her Building Bridges community CIC with the Rose & Crown pub to create a concept that revolutionises the role of a pub in today's challenging society.



Michelle has recently taken over the pub, located on Poulton Road, having owned Building Bridges in Birkenhead for the past four years. At Building Bridges, she created a community hub that offered a social supermarket, a donations-based salon and holistics service, kids clubs, support groups, an additional needs multisensory cafe and more. She then went on to open two more hubs in Redditch.



Now owner of the newly named The Crown Community Hub, Michelle will offer all the typical pub activities there such as live entertainment, bingo, Play Your Cards Right, pool and darts teams, live sport and food but it will also offer some vital services to serve the Wirral community. The venue is, in essence, becoming a cross between a pub and a community centre.

Michelle is bringing to the pub many of the things her Building Bridges community centre offered. There will be a social supermarket open Weds, Sat and Sun from 10am — 12pm, offering quality food, drink, clothing and more for a hugely discounted price as well as a donations based salon and holistics service.



The project will offer support groups, pamper packs for domestic violence victims, free hampers to families in need, affordable movie nights, free Christmas dinners and they will be offering heating, toast, tea, coffee and a television for £1 every day so people don't need to use their heating. There will also be parties for children and coach trips to places such as Chester Zoo.

After the success of the Christmas hamper campaign, Michelle has been working with Wirral Council who have funded £20,000 for food and essentials to get families through the last of the winter months. The

hub is also now putting on free food and entertainment to children between 3.30pm and 5.30pm on Wednesdays and Fridays.



Michelle said: "We're living in difficult times and it's time to bring pubs back to their original purpose — to be community hubs and meeting places that help, support and bring people together. We've been doing great things at the Building Bridges centres, helping all sorts of people — not just those struggling on benefits — and when the pub became available I thought about merging the two."

She continued: "Unfortunately many people suffer in silence as they are often too proud to come to places like Building Bridges — they worry about the stigma of 'handouts'. A pub is a very social place though so we're hoping that through the pub environment we can help even more people — combining all the fun pub activities with community outreach activities goes hand in hand really well."



Michelle has developed an incredible reputation in the local community through Building Bridges, winning Merseyside Woman Of The Year in 2020 and many others such as a Mecca Bingo Community Award and Redditch Business Awards Charity Of The Year. She is looking to bring all that knowledge and expertise to the new project at, bringing in her existing network at the same time.



Michelle explained: "This project is a huge one and I cannot do it alone. I'm about to embark upon a big refurb including replacing the windows, a new kitchen, painting and re-decorating and making the back yard a hidden gem. The project is all about community so I'm relying on the help of the local community and also The Prince's Trust kids. It's going to be a real team effort but it will be so worth it!"



Global charity, The Unity Of Faiths Foundation, has been praised by Mayor Of Liverpool, Joanne Anderson, for its services to the city. In a recent letter to the charity's Director, Dr. Shamender Talwar, Mayor Anderson declared him a 'gift to the city' due to his charity's work in Liverpool.



Dr. Talwar's charity, TUFF, has been running free mental health support for people in the city and a number of projects, including the Liverpool International Song Contest. Thanks to the efforts of Dr. Talwar and fellow TUFF trustee Daniel Xander, Siobhan Kennedy, President of PLA Media Pam Lewis and others, the ground-breaking partnership was created. The Mayor of Liverpool, Joanne Anderson, and the Deputy Mayor of Nashville, Brenda Haywood, made a pledge to work together on delivering sustainable economic global community benefits through trade, investment, science, technology, culture, education and tourism.



The discussions between both cities will establish various trade projects across many key sectors, in a move that could stimulate exciting growth and opportunities for many. It is this work, along with other ongoing projects and offering free mental health support to the people of Liverpool, that has led to Mayor Anderson praising Dr. Talwar in a recent letter.

Mayor Anderson said: "Your energy, dedication and passion is absolutely contagious and it is thanks to you that thousands of musicians have had support for their mental health. I am so proud that Liverpool has been part of the amazing initiative and I am excited about the future of our two cities going forward. Thank you

for involving us and to your father's love for our city, you are a gift to Liverpool."



Dr. Talwar, a leading social psychologist, founded TUFF with Anna Prior in 2013 and has helped countless people globally through various projects including their sports and education projects. Their recent KIND20 initiative, promoting and recognising acts of kindness throughout the world, reached millions of people and eventually came to Liverpool — where Dr. Talwar has roots.

Although based in London, Dr. Talwar's father was originally from Liverpool and working in the city feels like a homecoming for him — honouring his roots by serving the city. Both the mental health support and the explosion of the Liverpool Interational Song Contest have certainly made a huge impact, hence the powerful words from Mayor Joanne Anderson.

Dr. Talwar said: "When I was a child I spent lots of time in Liverpool and have fond memories of the city. It's very fitting that our charity and outreach work has now come to Liverpool and to be praised by Mayor Anderson in such a way is a real honour. The free mental health support has been well received and it's been wonderful to see the song contest grow."

He continued: "Liverpool holds a very special place in my heart and I am a big Liverpool FC fan. I come to the city regularly now and I'm looking forward to working with Mayor Anderson on future projects. The partnership we've created between Liverpool and Nashville is very exciting and it's being discussed in parliament so I'm very excited to see what opportunities it presents for the city."

The mental health support provided to music artists as part of the song contest's artist mental health support programme has been hugely successful and many have come forward to praise the charity further. EP, a single parent, found being a musician in the post Covid world and trying to feed her family particularly difficult and received free support.

She explained: "I am a single parent musician with the ongoing situation of survival in a post Covid world. When this offer was introduced, I was very intrigued about how this would work, but once I contacted the team and submitted my song, I had a wonderful person holding my hand through the process."

She continued: "Mental health illness can creep up anytime. With all the pressure to keep up with bills and feed my family, my sanity was boiling over. But thanks to the free sessions, which are priceless, The Road to Nashville programme saved my life and especially my daughter's too."



With ongoing projects, free mental health support and the ground-breaking new partnership between Liverpool and Nashville, the future for Liverpool is very bright with TUFF in town. In times when people are struggling and things are difficult, the work of charities to provide hope and bridge the gap is even more crucial now more than ever.

A Liverpool entertainer is on a mission to tackle loneliness in Merseyside. Ted Williams aka 'Jive Teddy' currently provides entertainment for over 1,500 people per month through his largely non-profit and low cost events — encouraging many older and marginalised people to become more socially active.



Singer and dancer Ted spends most of his spare time hosting events to encourage people, mostly the older members of the community, to become more socially active. Through his modern jive dancing nights and big events, his Happy Memories afternoon events and many other charitable causes he engages in, he dedicates his life to helping others.

In August 2011, Ted created his 'Jive Teddy' modern jive nights — a concept that has exploded in popularity and now attracts around 100 dancers every Monday at The Railway Club in Aintree. The nights have been responsible for many new friendships and has grown to include huge bi-monthly freestyle events at The Isla Gladstone alongside his good friend Pawl Anthony and weekends away.

Ted explained: "The Monday night modern jive events are inclusive, great fun and we've created a very special community. There's a DJ who plays everything from 50s music to modern chart music and plenty of the team on hand to assist — people of all abilities are welcome."

He continued: "The health, happiness, confidence and social benefits are amazing and it's an honour to help so many people through dance. The big events at The Isla Gladstone are brilliant, with people coming from all over the country to attend, and the dancing weekends away to places like Llandudno and Lytham are really special."



In addition to helping people get socially active through dance, Ted also has a Happy Memories group for older people that he runs jointly with his good friend Peter Bowyer. Happy Memories hosts five monthly events a month throughout Liverpool — featuring afternoons of live entertainment, dance, bingo, raffles and food.

The Happy Memories afternoons also draw in around 100 people for each event and feature top entertainment from the likes of, Pauline Daniels, Ricky Tomlinson Asa Murphy, Paul McCoy and Randy King. The events are just £5 to attend, with bingo optional, and they have been responsible for getting countless older people more socially active since they started in 2018.



Ted said: "Peter Bowyer and I are really proud of what we have created with Happy Memories. The idea is to put on top quality entertainment, dance, bingo, raffles and food at a very affordable price to get older people out of their houses and socializing. The live entertainment we offer is top class and very nostalgic — we've even had some tell us that it's helped with their loved ones' dementia."



Ted is also involved in many other community projects such as fronting the big monthly Plaza Cinema Community events for Julie Lawson. He also offers his singing and entertaining services to BNENC in Anfield, Everton In The Community, The League Of Welldoers with Tony Ravel, Bobby Dunne's Make A Difference charity and various churches and nursing homes.

Ted said: "The issue of loneliness amongst older people is a serious one. According to Age UK, more than 2 million people in England over the age of 75 live alone, and more than a million older people say they go for over a month without speaking to a friend, neighbour or family member." He continued: "I want to show people,

particularly older people, that it's important to remain socially active and there are some great things on offer for them if they just take that initial leap of faith. I do spend much of my spare time hosting and getting involved with these projects but I love what I do and I love to see so many happy faces and the effect the projects have on so many lives."

Despite so many different projects going on, Ted is showing no signs of slowing down on his mission to combat loneliness in the region. He and Peter are looking to expand the Happy Memories afternoons to more venues and spreading awareness of all the social events available for older and marginalised people in Merseyside.



Ted summarised: "There are many great events and projects out there for people to get involved in, from dancing to entertainment to days out and trips away. The key thing is to make people aware of these things — even if it means knocking on doors and telling them. Nobody should live life hidden away from the world and lonely."

Ted's Jive Teddy modern jive nights take place at The Railway Club in Aintree every Monday night, with big events at The Isla Gladstone every other month. The Happy Memories afternoons he runs with Peter Bowyer take place at Mount Carmel (Mondays, monthly), Woodlands (Thursdays, monthly), St. Cyril's (Thursdays, monthly), Dunnies (Thursdays, monthly) and Broadway Country Club (Mondays, monthly), The Conny Club on Derby Lane, Old Swan (Mondays).

In this La Vida Liverpool exclusive we talk to the man behind New Brighton's regeneration, Dan Davies. A successful businessman, Dan founded leading global company CPL Training, became Chairman of The Institute of Licensing and Board Member of UK Hospitality. Yet, instead of sitting on his fortunes, Dan has invested every penny of his money in his hometown.



Transforming the seaside town through creativity, culture and community spirit, Dan has created something very special in New Brighton through Rockpoint Leisure. From art and music to restaurants, bars and events, Dan has breathed new life into the area and here we talk to him about the past, present and future of New Brighton....

LVL: Great to chat with you as ever, Dan. Firstly, please could you tell us about your upbringing in New Brighton and where it all started for you?

DAN: I was born in 1973 and lived in Liscard, before moving down the road to New Brighton when I was 5 years old in 1978. The 80s was a real winter of discontent — I remember us not having central heating when we moved there and there was thick snow.

My era missed a lot of what New Brighton was founded to be about. The town was

formed in the 1830s by James Atherton, a merchant and architect who built New Brighton on 170 acres of sand dunes called Rock Point. This is why my regeneration project is called Rockpoint Leisure we have The James Atherton pub.

James Atherton based the new seaside town on the resort of Brighton and it went on to have 2 piers, 11 theatres, the largest ballroom in Europe, the largest tower in the country and the largest open air swimming baths in the world. At one point there were 5 million people per day visiting this great resort. Unfortunately, due to governments and councils, all these reasons to visit were taken away and the town fell into decline.

I was raised in New Brighton during its decline. There was a fair bit of vandalism and crime — a far cry from the reputation it once had. My first job was as a paperboy for Mr. Carruthers' shop and through reading the newspapers I learnt a lot about the world and politics and that the truth can be found in between all the varying perspectives. I read every paper and started questioning things.



LVL: Tell us about how you started CPL Training and became successful in business.

DAN: I worked in the hospitality industry from the age of 16 and by the time I was

18 I was the licensee at Coaster's on New Brighton promenade. It was during this time I set up CPL Training with my mate in his flat — offering personal alcohol license training. There was a huge gap in the market for it because it was only being offered to people within the industry — we took it to the mainstream and we soon had 4 training centres across the country.



Within a few years we had 80 training centres and it became an international business — working with the likes of Heineken and Coca Cola. It kind of helped that we didn't have any formal business training when we set up CPL because we did it our way, went against the grain and looked at things differently. We eventually became the market leader in the industry.

LVL: After becoming so successful, what made you decide to invest in your hometown instead of sitting back and getting rich?

DAN: Let me put it this way — I did a BBC Radio 4 interview back in 2019 and lots of things came out of that. I spoke with groups from all over the country including Love Wavertree, where businesses came together to fight the label of it being a bad place to live. A survey was done in Huddersfield where the thing local people wanted the most was to be proud of where they live.

Who wouldn't want to be proud of where they live? With the history and heritage we've got here, let's not allow it to get trampled upon! We can't live in the past but we need to nurture local talent and support local businesses in order to move forward for a better future.

If we keep it independent we're in charge of our own destiny and not just a blueprint town with the same big brands with no personality or individuality. Big corporates don't care, they just care about profit, and there are people who are making decisions about areas they have never visited. I want to change that and keep it local.

LVL: What inspired you to introduce all the street art to New Brighton?

DAN: When I was in Brooklyn on a conference I saw some of the regeneration work they were doing there and at the same time I was asked as Chairman of the Institute Of Licensing to organise a select committee on the future of seaside towns. What I saw in Brooklyn was lots of street art and independent businesses and it made me think about how that could be done in New Brighton.

The idea of street art is to attract footfall of course but to also get people walking around exploring the area. The art is a great talking point and it brings the buildings back to life but it also gets people to engage with the local businesses and people.



We've had local kids getting involved in the project alongside local artists and internationally renowned artists. The whole project is all about promoting creativity and for New Brighton to be a hub for creatives — from artists to bands such as The Mysterines and Razzmatazz.

LVL: You've invested everything into this project and pretty much singlehandedly transformed the area. What is your message to the council and government?

DAN: New Brighton was a managed decline. We lost 2 piers, 11 theatres, the largest ballroom in Europe that the Beatles played in, the largest tower in the country, the

largest open air baths in the world and went from being the 3rd largest seaside town in the country to the 68th. How was that allowed to happen? It's quite frankly gross mismanagement.

I've put over £7million into regenerating New Brighton but the council seem to want to spend money on everything but this project. Some amazing things have been happening here — we've created projects with LIPA and John Moore's University, we've been working with schools, music videos and movies have been filmed here. Nobody from the council or Liverpool region turns up. It's deeply frustrating.



LVL: As well as fighting for New Brighton, you've also been fighting a cancer battle. How have you got through that and what has your mentality been like?

DAN: I think the main thing is I've carried on working. Even before chemotherapy sessions I worked on the project, much to the disapproval of my consultant, but I had to keep busy — when you sit at home you just tend to dwell on it. The way I look at things is it's been an inconvenience having so much happening in New Brighton. You've just got to keep going.

What's also kept me going is the local community. You bump into people on the street and they ask how you are, you receive messages from people saying keep the fight up. We've got a great community here and it's something worth fighting for — I'll fight for it on my death bed and until my last breath.

LVL: What's going on with the project at the moment?

DAN: We're keeping things independent.

Two of the Rockpoint Leisure management team, Rob and Vicky, have opened Social 114 — a cracking little coffee shop, restaurant and bar. Rockpoint Records has become a real hub with a bar, food from The South Indian, a record shop and a tattoo shop and live music.



The Mysterines played at Rockpoint Records in the summer, a local band who are doing massive things globally. Many local artists, musicians and other creatives work from Victoria Road and there's a diverse mix of people here. It's a great place to be and there's always something going on. We're continuing to be a platform for local people and we're remaining fiercely independent.

LVL: What are your thoughts about the future of New Brighton?

DAN: It depends on whether the council are willing to recognise this as a pilot project for regeneration. The House Of Lords has recognised the model, as have councils from all over the country and many authorities, institutions and universities. This is a project that is gift wrapped for them, an open goal that they shouldn't volley into row Z again.

This isn't about me. It's about people who live in New Brighton and their hopes and dreams for generations to come. I created this project to turn the fortunes around of the town I grew up in and we need to attract and retain talent. It is vitally important that we work together to create somewhere we can thrive and be proud of where we come from. We've proved the concept, so let's have some backing and make this seaside town great again.





There is also a large flexi room where you can join group classes.

The expansion project is due to commence in February 2023 and will encompass additional fitness and recreational spaces including, dedicated boxing suite, PT pods, Virtual Racing Rig, sensory deprivation floatation tank and automated massage chair.

The concept is the brainchild of Wayne Hughes, who came up with the idea after suffering an injury and becoming very self-conscious when working out in his local gym. He realised that there are many people who would prefer their own private workout space, so decided to offer something to bridge the gap between a home gym and a big communal set up.

Wayne explained: "After injuring my shoulder I went through a bit of rehabilitation before easing my way back into the gym. I had to work out with bands due to my injuries and I couldn't help but feel self-conscious — taking up space, getting in people's way and other gym users giving me funny looks." He continued: "I decided to buy some equipment and began to work out and do yoga from home but it was a nightmare — with distractions, lack of motivation, not enough room and the even the dog getting in the way!."



Barerooms offers an alternative to a big gym membership or working out at home — with single, double, and group suites that all have HD projectors allowing for the next best thing to a 121 personal training session. Members benefit from personal assigned programmes and a variety of activities, Micro gyms that provide all equipment for

The virtual reality suite has all sorts of games including a VR treadmill and attractions where you can run, jump and walk safely. Meanwhile, the virtual golf simulator is a golfer's dream — with training, stats and a wide variety of driving ranges and courses to choose from. With so much going on and a big emphasis on inclusivity, Barerooms is a forward-thinking concept like no other.

Wayne summarized: "There's nothing like this anywhere and it really does bridge the gap and offer something different for people who want their own private workout space. There are many, many, reasons people are uncomfortable exercising in public and nothing out there that meets this need so it's important that all industries step up to the mark and offer something more accessible and inclusive. That's what our aim is, anyway."

Barerooms offer personal trainers the opportunity to build their business through low-cost PT memberships and first month free! They also welcome instructors who want to run group classes at very competitive rates!



A Wirral mother is leading the fight against the child mental health crisis through her concept, Merseyside Mindful Mammas. Aimee Greaves is a mental health nurse with over 15 years' experience and offers a number of services to bridge the gap, with NHS waiting lists up to 12 months long.



With 1 in 6 children aged 5 to 16 years old identified as having a probable mental disorder in the official 2020 NHS report, the figure is likely to have increased further following Covid. Merseyside Mindful Mammas aims to tackle that by offering mental health services to children as well as empowering the parents.

Aimee said: "I set up Merseyside Mindful Mammas in 2018 after struggling with my mental health during pregnancy. I came to realise that there was a lack of support out there focused on the mental health of both

children and parents so decided to create something that would bridge the gap."

Merseyside Mindful Mammas offers a number of services such as mental health sessions for children, children's circles and workshops — featuring things such as mindfulness, meditation and yoga – and Family Connections where both parents and children can work together.

For parents, she offers hypnobirthing, women's circles and workshops, mindfulness, meditation and yoga, rite of the womb healing, post natal massage, shamanic healing, mental health awareness sessions and more. The idea is to tackle child mental health issues by working with both children and the parents.



Aimee offers all services either on a 1-2-1 basis, with parents and children together or in groups, with regular events and retreats such as Family Connections — where children and parents engage in holistic activities together. Aimee also offers 2 day Youth Mental Health First Aid course, where adults can become Youth Mental Health First Aid specialists.

The first aid courses are for everyone who works with, lives with or supports young people aged 8-18 and they teach people how to listen, reassure and respond to potential mental health issues. Aimee gives people the skills to be able to tackle issues, even before they arise, and people come away with an internationally accredited Mental Health First Aid qualification.



Aimee said: "Since setting up Merseyside Mindful Mammas, I've seen a shocking increase in very sad cases. I've had children as young as 5 years old saying they don't want to be here and at the same time I've seen more mothers having breakdowns. My aim is to help as many children as possible but also the parents so that they can be the best they can be for their children."

She continued: "I'm also very passionate about delivering the Youth Mental Health First Aid courses. There's a major issue with the lack of adults in a position to help children with mental health problems. The more people trained in youth mental health the better as they can catch the early signs and prevent crisis through early intervention."



Combining science and spirituality, Merseyside Mindful Mammas uses a wide variety of mental health techniques from her 15 years' experience as a mental health nurse, as well as practises such as mindfulness, meditation and yoga. Aimee has vast experience working within CAMHS (Children & Adult Mental Health Services) and has seen some great results through her work.

Aimee explained: "Tackling children's mental health issues on a 1-2-1 basis through mental health counselling is a big part of what I do but it's just as important to work with the parents. I work with mothers before, during and after pregnancy and work with both children and parents together in order to strengthen their bond and promote mental, emotional and spiritual wellbeing."





THE CAN GUY

At the Tesco garage by my home we often see 'The can guy'. He sits outside on the concrete floor, cross-legged and creates little ash trays out of old drinks cans. I stood there for a little while today watching him fold them into form, it's quite an intricate practice. I started thinking about the mechanism of it, not so much the mechanics of him making them, rather - the social mechanism employed. It's beautifully subtle in the way that it protects his pride. He obviously needs a few quid, but the process makes him a creative rather than a beggar. He just sits there making his little ash trays, he never even looks up, and every now and then, here and there, someone will walk past and ask "Hey, how much are they?" And he'll reply (as if he's half too busy to answer) and say "just a donation mate". Then they'll drop him a pound, pick a little ashtray up, and be on their way. As well as protecting him from the embarrassment of begging, it also protects us from the awkwardness of being begged. It's perfect.

I respect ingenuity and creativity. If we lived more rurally, maybe he'd make necklaces out of hag stones he found in the river.

Or if we lived more coastally perhaps, he'd make bracelets with seashells. But we live in the city, in the heart of a socioeconomic cigarettes and alcohol culture, so he makes ash trays recycled out of Coca Cola and Strongbow cans. And there's a beauty in that if you can see it as a chance to help someone without encroaching too much upon their pride. Urban arts and crafts manufactured out of necessity, available resources, and human ingenuity. Sometimes an object is greater than the sum of its parts. So, is it art or is it ash trays? That depends on your world view. The dictionary says that art is... 'the expression or application of human creative skill and imagination, typically in a visual form such as painting or sculpture, producing works to be appreciated primarily for their beauty or emotional power.'

So, in conclusion, today...

I bought a nice piece of art.

A powerful new play aims to recognise Liverpool activist James Larkin — 100 years after his release from Sing Sing prison. The enigmatic Irish republican, socialist and trade union leader, who campaigned for the rights of lower skilled workers, is portrayed like never before by Liverpool playwrights and a talented cast who wish to see him finally recognised by his city of birth.



Stone On Stone is a ground-breaking theatrical masterpiece based on James Larkin's incarceration in the notorious American prison, Sing Sing, and his relationship with the legendary Charlie Chaplin during that time. A rebel and revolutionary from Toxteth, Liverpool, 'Big Jim' has been recognised in Ireland for his heroic human rights efforts — yet never by Liverpool.



The profound new production is coming to The Epstein Theatre in Liverpool on Friday 24th and Saturday 25th March, celebrating 100 years of James Larkin's release from prison. The Liverpudlian dock worker of Irish descent was one of the pioneers of trade unions and one of the founders of the Irish Labour Party — a trailblazer who has yet to receive official recognition in Liverpool.



The thought provoking new play is being showcased by The James Larkin Society — a group who have been campaigning for 'Big Jim' to be recognised by Liverpool. His triumphant efforts that led to countless unskilled workers receiving statutory rights saw a statue of him erected in Dublin, yet The James Larkin Society are are still working towards something similar in the place where he was born.



Stone On Stone tells the story of James Larkin's fight against the establishment and his dedication to his downtrodden co-workers, resulting in his detainment in the American jail for fundraising and raising awareness of injustice. The play follows his journey through the prison system and encounters with Charlie Chaplin, who was a big supporter of his cause.

As with any great production, the ground-breaking new play aims to not only enthral the audience but bring about social change. Today's equality, fairness and human rights is only possible due to activists such as James Larkin and the mission of Stone On Stone is to highlight the unsung hero, whilst encouraging people to stand up for their rights in the same way.



Barry O'Hara from The James Larkin Society said: "Everything we take for granted today — our minimum wage, holiday pay, equal rights — is due to people like James Larkin. If it wasn't for their resistance we would be living in the dark ages — submissive and without any rights."

He continued: "It takes great bravery to rise up and fight an unjust system but Jim was prepared to become a martyr and it is his actions that have paved the way for the free world we live in today. He is celebrated in a big way in Ireland so surely, after 100 years of his release from Sing Sing prison in America, it's about time to recognise him here in Liverpool."



The James Larkin Society was founded in 2003, attracting almost 150 members, and it works closely with Ireland's Services Industrial Professional and Technical Union (SIPTU) to ensure Jim's legacy and ethics are carried out today. Carrying the baton of 'Big Jim', Barry O'Hara and the society preserve his revolution of justice passionately — with an exhibition currently at the CASA on Hope Street.

Co-Producer Peter Devaney said: "The play is very unique as it captures a very important yet unspoken part of the movement. It was written by Frank Kenny and explores the pivotal moment when Jim decided to accept support from Charlie Chaplin whilst incarcerated. He was a very stubborn man and fought the system at any cost but accepting the support of the great Charlie Chaplin was a crucial decision."

Stone On Stone is coming to The Epstein Theatre on Friday 24th and Saturday 25th March in celebration of 100 years of James Larkin's release from prison. 

A Wirral woman who has suffered from mental health problems and attempted to take her own life multiple times now empowers other women through Style Coaching (TM). Claire Welch-Beasley, 31, has fought a long battle with ADHD and borderline personality disorder but now helps other women step into their power with her business, Wardrobe Warriors.



Claire is a Style Coach (TM) with a difference — taking women on a journey of self-discovery and helping them become more confident in the process. She works with women who have been through trauma or suffer from lack of self worth by helping them with life coaching, setting goals, affirmations, discovering their style, creating a new wardrobe, working on their body language, NLP, Reiki and more.

Claire offers one off sessions and workshops or a full 6 month bespoke transformation programme — taking women on a journey to become the best version of themselves and 'fearlessly authentic'. Her unique business, created in February 2020, has been given some amazing feedback from the women she has helped but it's the story behind it that makes it even more special.



Claire explained: "I've been on a monumental journey of change to get to where I am today and be in a place where I can now help others. It all started for me in school where I was known as a 'goth' or 'rocker' and alternative dresser with acne and glasses — this led to some pretty harsh bullying, being called 'freak' and 'weirdo' amongst other things."

She continued: "The bullying was unbearable and I developed social anxiety — spending most of my time in my bedroom. By the time I was 13 I had self harmed and this led to several suicide attempts through my teenage years. By the time I left school I was a shell and I sought refuge in abusive relationships with narcissists who took what was left of me."



Claire's most serious suicide attempt in 2012, when she was 21, led to her seeking help and being diagnosed with ADHD and a borderline personality disorder. She sought therapy until she was 25 — when she

discovered the law of attraction and then Reiki as therapies that helped her greatly.

She explained: "It was really a case of managing my pain and mental health problems but the real breakthrough was with the law of attraction. I began to 'fake it' by being positive about myself and people around me and found that miraculously good things started to happen — I even began to feel more happy within myself. Then I discovered reiki healing and that was the next step of my evolution."

Despite feeling misunderstood and like an outcast for most of her life, style and image was always something she adored and as found comfort in. No matter how bad the bullying got, Claire was adamant that 'fitting in' was the last thing she wanted to do and she stood her ground despite the social pressures.

Claire said: "From the age of 8 I was creating my own alternative fashion clothing — ripping clothes to bits and creating new wild or gothic designs. I absolutely love design, creativity and style and in 2019 I pursued my dream by achieving a Diploma in Style Coaching (TM) with The Style Coaching Institute (C) — achieving the highest score possible — and that's I came up with the Wardrobe Warriors concept."





In addition to qualifying as a Style Coach (TM), Claire trained in Reiki, NLP, crystal therapy and City & Guilds Level 2 Pattern Cutting. Through Wardrobe Warriors, Claire has become much more than a Style Coach (TM) — offering a holistic approach by helping women heal their relationships with both themselves and their image — becoming their true, authentic and best versions of themselves.



Hello and welcome to the Travel section of La Vida Liverpool magazine, where we capture your imagination and invigorate your senses by taking you away to some of the most beautiful places this world has to offer!



In this feature we explore Egypt, staying on Makadi Bay — a gorgeous beach resort just outside the city of Hurghada. Located on the Red Sea, Hurghada was founded in the early 20th century as a little fishing village but has now exploded into a popular destination with very warm temperatures all year round and an average temperature in the 20s in January.

As Owner of La Vida Liverpool I had been working extremely hard throughout 2022, so a January break somewhere warm for my birthday was needed as much as it was desired. I searched far and wide to find that holiday prices had risen dramatically but fortunately La Vida Liverpool's new travel agent partner managed to secure me a fantastic 4* all inclusive deal on the Egyptian coast — 14 nights for £1,168.

I flew from Manchester on New Year's
Day morning — heading to Labranda Club
Makadi for my amazing 14 night all inclusive
deal, a steal given the current climate and
some of the other quotes I was getting.
Prior to my adventure, I set about asking

advice from people who had already been there and got some valuable information and contacts.



I was travelling solo and wanted a nice blend of relaxation and exploration, vowing to not have one of those crazy holidays where you need another to recover from it! Labranda Club Makadi seemed the perfect choice — with a good range of restaurants, spa and gym facilities, a beautiful beach and plenty of trips and excursions available.



My friend Graham had visited many times and put me in touch with a legendary tour guide named 'Elvis' (real name Mohamed, as so many Egyptian men are called). Having discussed all the options with him, I decided on a boat trip to Giftun Island, a swimming with wild dolphins trip, Luxor and a Quad bike desert safari — four fantastic action packed days built around much needed relaxation and down time.

The first thing to tell you about Egypt is prepare to be sold to! As soon as I arrived at the airport there were baggage porters waiting to take my suitcase for a fee and

I had been at the hotel for less than 5 minutes before one of the boutique shop owners tried his utmost to sell me Egyptian glow in the dark prints (yes, I bought one for £10 in the end).



In Egypt they love to haggle and you'll soon learn to barter for literally everything to want to buy. They are such determined sales people though and I would love to get them over here to sell advertising for this magazine — we'd clear up with the Egyptians on the graft! Oh, and here's a little tip — get your Egyptian visa (around £20) before you fly, as it saves extra queuing at Hurghada airport upon arrival.

With my excursions pre-booked from a reliable source and for a great price (just £140 for all four trips), I spent my first couple of days taking it easy and appreciating the heat compared to the bitter cold back home. I spoke with the hotel spa manager, another relentless salesperson who I had to hard-haggle with, and booked in a Turkish Hammam & massage plus four further one hour massages for £200. I spent the first couple of days creating a nice routine of a morning run along the bay,



hitting the outdoor beach gym and then relaxing by the pool, drinking all inclusive cocktails, meeting new friends and sampling the great quality and variety of the hotel restaurants.

In January it gets light early and dark around 5pm, so I'd recommend waking up early to

enjoy as much of the sun as possible (it can get a fair bit cooler in the evenings, so do pack some warmer clothes). I managed to evade the lively hotel nightclub, Coco Loco, for the first few days but that soon changed as I met new friends in the hotel.



On Wednesday 4th January it was my birthday and what better way to spend it than a visit to the idyllic Giftun Island? Elvis arranged my pick up from the hotel at 7.45am and I was taken with other guests to the departure point for an action packed boat trip that included two snorkelling sessions, dolphin spotting, a couple of hours on the stunning Orange Bay on Giftun Island and a banana boat ride.

I met some more fantastic new friends and the tour guides Fox, Ahmed and the crew were fun and charismatic — with some amazing photographs supplied for an extra cost. I was a pure novice at snorkelling but the guys were great tutors and I managed to see some incredible sea life amongst the coral reef.



Witnessing dolphins leaping out of the water alongside our boat was a truly breathtaking thing to experience on my birthday and it was most definitely one of the best birthdays I've ever had! There are a couple of different boat trips from Hurghada — to Giftun Island and Paradise Island — and I'd fully recommend them!

Although the hotel has a great range of all inclusive restaurants, I couldn't resist paying extra for the seafood restaurant on the beach as a special meal for my birthday. This proved to be a great choice, as three of us dined for just £25 per head and it included starters, fresh lobster, desserts and unlimited wine — the finest food and unbelievable value!



The hotel nightclub, Coco Loco, is situated on its own little island and it soon lured me in, as I met some amazing people and formed some fantastic new friendships with a plethora of different people from different countries. We made some unforgettable memories together.

This is the thing I love most about travelling — connecting with people from all over the world and proving that contrary to what the media tells us and the wars world leaders create, people are mostly good and we can all live together in harmony. I think that by developing these relationships we are doing our bit for world peace — every positive interaction at a time.

I actually decided not to go on the wild dolphin swimming trip, as much as I wanted to, as I felt I wasn't a strong enough swimmer to be able to do it properly — snorkelling was probably my limit. Boat trip guide and photographer, Ahmed, showed me some of his incredible underwater captures though and it was amazing to see what is possible if you're a decent swimmer.



Makadi Bay is a superb destination for quality hotels that have a variety of different excursions — in addition to the ones I mentioned, there are trips to Cairo and The Pyramids (both very long days), Nile cruises and more. Elvis is the guy to go to for these trips — with much better prices than the hotel ones and package discounts for booking multiple experiences.

My next excursion was to Luxor — a long 16 hour day but well worth it! I was picked up at 5am and joined other tourists from different hotels on a coach, again forming new friendships with many other nationalities. Our tour guide, Mimo, was very entertaining and had a wealth of knowledge. During our 5 hour coach journey he wowed us with his great knowledge of Egyptian history, culture and customs.







Watersports such as kitesurfing and wing foiling have grown massively in popularity in recent years, with many people realising the mental as well as physical health benefits of getting out on the water.

Testament to this is the story of Adam Crouch, 35, who ditched his high-pressure job in London, following a breakdown, to set up the Wirral's only licenced Kitesurfing & Wing Foiling school, called Northern Kites, based at Wallasey Beach, New Brighton.



For 13 years, Adam was working in Construction Project Management in London — a hazardous job that consisted of dangerous operations, strict health and safety, and tight programmes and budgets. The high-pressure role, including an incident that almost led to his own death, was the final straw which spurred him into leaving the construction industry.

Adam explained: "Over 13 years in the job, paired with the fast-paced lifestyle of living in London, took a massive hit on my mental health which led to depression and a breakdown.

"While on a short kitesurfing holiday to help improve my health, it was decided that I would leave my job. Upon returning, there was an incident which nearly led to my death, and I knew I had made the correct decision."



Adam decided to escape the UK with a three month kitesurfing trip, taking him to Europe and Africa. This time wasn't enough for him to recover, so he trained as a kitesurfing instructor and spent the summer of 2019 in Greece teaching the sport. He fell in love with the kitesurfing life and yowed never to return to the rat race.



While away, Covid started and Adam had to return home, but within two weeks of returning, lockdown hit, plunging him into depression again.

Adam explained: "After being so free, the lockdown was very difficult for me. As soon as we were allowed out I headed to the Wirral to scope out where it was possible to kitesurf. I found an amazing community of kitesurfers, but there was no kite school.

Word got out that I was an instructor and the demand for lessons skyrocketed. This was the start of Northern Kites in the Summer of 2020."



After falling in love with New Brighton, Adam set up Northern Kites at Wallasey Beach. The only licensed Kitesurfing and Wing Foiling School in Wirral and North West of England. He is now setting up a Watersports shop based at the beach.

Northern Kites offers full courses that take people with no previous experience right through to being competent independent kitesurfers. They also offer taster sessions for those who want to learn, with countless 5-star reviews and one of the top-rated schools in the UK.

The team at Northern Kites has grown over the last 2 years and now has 8 instructors. And Northern Kites has now been accredited to train new instructors, offering others the opportunity to follow a career in this amazing sport.

The sport is open to anyone from young to old (their oldest student so far was 73 years of age, and the youngest 12 years old) and has a dedicated ladies community.

Adam explained: "I've really found my home here back in the North West doing what I love and it's been amazing getting so many people involved in kitesurfing. Watersport is really good for mental health, as well as fitness, getting out in nature, and the social aspect of it.



The scene here in Wirral is growing massively and we have lots of events taking place out of the new Wallasey Beach Club, based at the premises of the old West Cheshire Sailing Club."



The vibrant community now based at Northern Kites and Wallasey Beach Club is really putting New Brighton on the map as a mecca for watersports, with new and experienced kitesurfers, and other water and beach enthusiasts coming from all over the UK to enjoy our fantastic beaches and outdoor life.

Wirral's watersport community is growing at a rate of knots, with an ever-increasing community of sailors, kitesurfers, surfers, stand-up paddlers, kayakers, cold water swimmers and others.

Adam continued: "Honestly, I don't know where I'd be if I hadn't pursued my dream of kitesurfing. The truth is I'd probably be dead due to the sheer pressure and stress from my old career. I was in a really dark place and had bad thoughts, but now I'm a lot happier and want to show others the mental health benefits of getting out on the water."



We recently attended the huge open weight fighting contest, Jigoku, at Poulton Vics in Wallasey. The extravaganza featured a number of fights between MMA fighters, Muay Thai fighters, kick boxers, Brazilian Jujitsu artists, karate fighters, wrestlers and more.



It was some showcase and not the aggressive, pumped up masculine event you'd expect — it was competitive, yes, but held in good spirits with a great atmosphere and camaraderie. This is due to the founder and organiser, DAVE Faulkner, and his positive philosophy.

In this feature we catch up with Dave — a good man and a legend of the Liverpool fighting scene. Dave Faulkner is the first Scouse Ultimate Fighter, 1 time MMA World Champion, 2 time World Submission Wrestling Champion, 1 time World Arm Wrestling Champion, a multi-time judo, freestyle and submission wrestling Champion, a black belt at K1 kick boxing and ex Coach of the England WMKF submission wrestling squad.

Dave has also been a sparring partner of Mike Bisping, a training partner of Quinton Jackson (Mr.T in The A Team), a bodyguard of Idris Elba and other celebrities and is a respected Liverpool doorman. A voice for anti-bullying, the No More Knives campaign and a respected referee, actor and author, Dave is one of the good guys of the fight game and a fascinating character.

Here's our interview as we get his opinions on Jigoku, wrestling, the UFC and more....

LVL: What's the wrestling scene like these days?

DAVE: So firstly I have to clear this up.
The wrestling I watched in 1982 and similar organisations like WWE is called Professional wrestling and is "worked", which means the outcome of the bout, also certain action during said bout are predetermined. The wrestling that the "cuddling fellas" were doing is called amateur/freestyle wrestling and is a legitimate sport that contested in the olympics.

So now that's been addressed, the Professional scene is absolutely booming! The amateur side, we have the talent but we don't have the backing, so most wrestlers are moving over to other combat sports like MMA.



LVL: Tell us about your time in the UFC and being the first Scouse Ultimate Fighter.

DAVE: That fact didn't hit me until way after the show when I was prepping for another interview. With regards to my time there, I had an enlightening experience. I'd managed to win my first fight while having no skin on the bottom of my right foot and five days notice. I met some awesome people one the show, Dana White not being one of them.

It was just hard luck getting a staph infection and bronchitis at the same time. I was a strong favorite from the start but I was confident enough to have another crack at it one day. To be honest, I'd fell out of love with MMA around that time and was only doing the show for court funds. That's another story all together.



LVL: What do you think about the UFC today?

DAVE: I'm not a fan anymore due to, firstly, silly childhood reasons. Fighters use to look like action figures. They mostly look like malnourished teenagers. Secondly, and most importantly, the promotion of negativity! Without sounding like a cheeseball, kids watch this now! Kids tend to emulate these people.

When you've got these grown men saying ridiculous and vile things to each other, bare in mind that the day before they were announced to fight didn't acknowledge each other, kids think that's how you get ahead in the sport and start talking to other kids like this, it's a joke!

LVL: What was it like being bodyguard to celebrities?

DAVE: Any interesting stories to tell us? I'll do a quick fire round, like a game show! Kurt Angle was a straight up cool dude! Idris Elba needs to smoke less pot! Mickey Dolenz

was not aware that he was in Rob Zombie's Halloween!

It's been good but I always got these jobs by chance, I never went looking for this type of work. They all get the vibe when you're not starstruck. they either hit with all their accolades, try to impress you with sexcapades or just talk to you like a normal person.



LVL: How did you get involved in the No More Knives campaign?

DAVE: Through the founder and also my friend, Paul "Boom Boom" Bentley. I mostly referee his charity fight shows but I'm looking to get more involved...so watch this space.

LVL: What next for DAVE Faulkner?

DAVE: Since I got into a spot of bother with the law, which I should have received a medal for and not community hours! I lost a lot of work due to losing my work permits and I also had to shut my gym down. I'd been down this path too many times and to quote Einstein "Insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting different results" so a change of momentum was in order!

I got a major movie role, as the baddie no less, which I done all the fight choreography for. I've also been living a childhood dream by doing a bit of Professional Wrestling but the door is always open for new ventures though!
