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

This quarter our focus is on West Kirby's Karma Indian Food.

What's Karma About?

Located on Grange Road in the heart of West Kirby, Karma is not your average Indian restaurant and is certainly worth a venture to the North West tip of the Wirral peninsular for! What's On The Menu?

At Karma you'll find a refined menu that's clearly broken down into sections — with each dish obsessively curated by Head Chef Hussain Miah. Taught to be a perfectionist by his Grandma, Hussain painstakingly experiments with ingredients and spices to perfect mouth-watering dishes with a unique Karma twist.

Rather than play it safe with your go to dishes, why not try a few small plates such as Salmon Tikka, Kathi Roll or Spiced Lamb? If you're looking for a new favourite main dish, feel free to chat to Hussain and the team about your preferences and they'll recommend the ideal dish for you. Whatever you choose, it will be different at Karma — that's for sure!





The Vegan & Gluten Free Options....

One of the things that really sets Karma apart is how the restaurant has embraced vegan and gluten free diners. Karma has a refined menu but also has separate menus dedicated to vegans and those with a gluten intolerance — rather than it being an afterthought or expecting the diner to navigate the main menu.

The vegan and gluten free menus are broken down in sections, much the same as the main menu, and whilst they are refined they offer plenty of options. A fine example of how Karma has adapted seamlessly to the needs of a changing world, there are simple menus yet there's a dish for everyone.



In this regular feature, we bring you our Pub Of The Quarter and for December 2023 we've chosen The Ship Inn, Hoylake! Dynamic couple Loz and Vic have completely transformed The Ship since 'taking the helm' back in 2020 and today it offers top quality food, live music, Irish jam sessions, live sport, a quiz, artisan markets, community events and more!



Fantastic Food!

The Ship offers some of the best pub food around 7 days a week and the latest menu is packed with hearty winter warmers such as locally sourced fish and handcut chips, award winning Pieminster pies, slowroast gammon in clementine and ginger and quality steaks from Scott's. Their Hoylake Fisheries Seafood Chowder is epic and comes with king prawns, salmon, cod and mussels with crusty bread.



The Ship is all about using fresh ingredients from local suppliers and Mon-Thurs 12-9pm they offer 2 main courses for £25. On Sundays, their 'Sunday Social' most often sells out — featuring their divine roasts and legendary Sunday Roast Sharers with trimmings such as pigs in blankets and honey and wholegrain parsnips.





Music, Markets & More!

The Ship puts on the best artists and bands in the region every Friday and Saturday night and The Coral, Nigel Clark of Dodgy make appearances alongside top local cover acts. Loz and Vic have transformed the carpark into a large outdoor area that hosts artisan markets on the last weekend of every month and huge events in the summer. Meanwhile, there's a gem of a beer garden to the rear.



More Than Just A Pub....

Whilst remaining very humble, Loz and Vic have done many things for charity and local causes and The Ship is very much a community hub. During lockdowns they delivered up to 80 free meals per day to vulnerable members of the community, raised thousands for foodbanks by giving away good beer that couldn't be sold and raised money for Built Care Packs for keyworkers through their online festival.



Although it's not something they like to shout about, Loz has previously been shortlisted for Licensee Of The Year by The Publican and accredited with Beautiful Beer Gold Award, whilst Vic has won an award for Most Inspirational Female In Liverpool for International Women's Day. Over the years, the couple have raised tens of thousands of pounds for good causes through their pubs.

Local legends Loz and Vic have also transformed another Hoylake pub. Situated off the beaten track on Lake Place, The Lake is a traditional pub oozing with character that has live music, jam nights, quiz nights, live sport and a great atmosphere. If you're looking for a fine pint and a great night out in Hoylake, The Lake is an absolute gem too!

A new Chinese 'super restaurant' has opened in Chinatown, offering up to 300 covers over three floors, private dining and events spaces and a rooftop terrace opening soon. Man Tsuen Ho's Restaurant has opened on Nelson Street after an extensive two year refurbishment and has already received countless 5 star reviews.



The new restaurant aims to set the standard and revolutionise Chinese dining in Liverpool. The restaurant is open 7 days a week and offers all diners access to both the classic Chinese restaurant style dishes and traditional authentic Chinese dishes — giving people access to alternative dishes they wouldn't usually get to try.



With thousands of combinations of dishes on the menu, Man Tsuen Ho's Restaurant also has an extensive Dim Sum lunch menu and a 'Create Your Own Dish' menu — whilst there's a big focus on cocktails and top quality service. Since opening in June 2023, diners have been raving about it.



Some of the favourite dishes amongst diners have been Three Roast Meats, Char Sui Baos, Crispy Lamb and seafood dishes such as Seabass and Lobster — with plenty of vegetarian and gluten free options available on the extensive menu. At Man Tsuen Ho's Restaurant, you'll find not only top quality but also a vast quantity of dishes.



Despite having a plush modern feel to it, Man Tsuen Ho's Restaurant offers great value for money and a number of private events have been enjoyed in the private function venue spaces — free to hire for large groups to celebrate special occasions. Wilson Ho explained: "Many Chinese restaurants are very traditional in their offerings and we aim to bridge that gap. Whereas the traditional Chinese menu is usually separate for Chinese, we have opened it up for all diners — giving them some alternative choices and therefore offering thousands of combinations of dishes. Our extensive Dim Sum menu has been very popular too."

He continued: "With our menu being so extensive, we have different kitchen departments and specialists in different types of cooking. All food is cooked fresh from scratch and we make our own chilli oils and sauces. We are big on service too — as many Chinese restaurants lack the customer interaction. We have plans to open the roof terrace in 2024 and our bigger vision is that we will help spark Chinatown's regeneration."



Liverpool's Chinatown is the oldest in Europe however some buildings lie dormant and often tourists will just come to the area to get a photograph underneath the arch and then go elsewhere.

The Ho family hopes the idea of a 'super restaurant' will bring more footfall to the area and they are entering talks with Liverpool City Council to see what more can be done to improve the area.

Tommy Ho said: "Liverpool is rich in Chinese heritage and we want to honour that by opening this very special restaurant in Chinatown, whilst also looking to the future and hoping it will lead to more developments in the area. So far the feedback has been outstanding and people are saying there's nowhere quite like it around — especially after trying some of our alternative dishes!"



Man Tsuen Ho's Restaurant has opened on Nelson Street after an extensive two year refurbishment and features three dining floors for up to 300 people, private dining rooms and a roof terrace coming soon. Wirral's first Sri Lankan restaurant has opened in Hoylake — serving mouth watering authentic dishes that locals are raving about. The Hut has received a multitude of 5 star reviews since opening on Market Street in August and diners have loved sampling flavoursome and unique Sri Lankan dishes for the first time.



The Hut is the loving creation of husband and wife team Gayan and Shanika, who moved to Wirral with their three children in 2021, and their aim is to introduce the people of Wirral to the best cuisine Sri Lanka has to offer. The intimate little gem has gone down a storm since opening and the family have been overwhelmed by the positive feedback and warm welcome from locals.



Food is prepared using fresh ingredients and spices are shipped from the fields of Sri Lanka by Shanika's father, whilst she uses recipes passed down from her late mother. From Devilled Corner (a devilishly delicious dish that packs a punch of flavour) to Beach Combo (Casava wrapped and baked in banana leaf with coconut) to Mutton Curry, the dishes are intriguing and creative.



The restaurant is also the first to introduce 'Hoppers' to Wirral, a type of rice flour pancake filled with curry and topped with sambol and chutney. Glowing reviews of The Hut have been coming in thick and fast, with customers quoting things such as "amazing food, lovely people", "gorgeous meal with lovely friendly service" and "fantastic, authentic, awesome, tasty food."

One customer said: "Great meal at The Hut last night. First time for both of us trying Ceylon/Sri Lankan cuisine. Gayan explained the menu to us and explained how it was all cooked from scratch using fresh ingredients and the difference between SriLanka and Indian food! What we had was amazing and we will definitely be back to explore the menu further. Would highly recommend a visit."



Gayan explained: "Ever since moving to Wirral from London, we've been so happy. The people here are very friendly and to have all these 5 star reviews already fills us with joy. When people come into our restaurant, for us it is like them coming into our home so we put all our love into every dish and treat our customers like family."



Whilst in London, Shanika's Sri Lankan cuisine became a big hit — firstly making food from home for event catering and eventually catering for high end millionaire clients in Bishops Avenue, Finchley. After discovering the Wirral through some friends, Gayan and Shanika fell in love with the area and decided to fulfil their dream of opening their own restaurant.



Shanika said: "It is a dream for us to open our first restaurant and Wirral's first Sri Lankan restaurant here in Hoylake. It is particularly special for me as I feel like my mother is still at work — to see people enjoying the recipes she taught me is so lovely and to have Sri Lankan spices sent from my father in our dishes is also magical. It feels great to provide the people of Wirral with the best flavours from our country."



Having recruited their best friend 'Eddie', the family's new gem has fast become the talk of the seaside town and they are often fully booked at weekends. Inviting diners to immerse themselves in a fusion of flavours, aromas, spices and colours, The Hut brings something truly unique to the Hoylake high street.



Gayan summarised: "It's great to offer something different to the people of Wirral and show them the delights from our country. We're big on spices, many of which have healing properties, and all our dishes pack lots of flavour. So far the feedback has been amazing and we want to introduce as many people as possible to Sri Lankan food."



The Hut has opened at 88 Market Street, Hoylake, offering authentic Sri Lankan dishes cooked fresh from scratch using authentic recipes and spices sent from Sri Lanka. The restaurant is open Tues-Thurs 5pm-9pm, Fri-Sat 5pm-11pm and Sun 5pm-9pm.

A Nepalese civil war escapee has finally fulfilled his dream of owning his own restaurant and has done so in Wirral. Jeevan Kandel, 37, fled horrific war crimes and brutality in Nepal — going on to work at top restaurants in Dubai and London before settling in Moreton where his Mexican restaurant, Piri Siri, is receiving 5 star reviews.



Top chef Jeevan came to Wirral with his wife and two little girls in 2016, following an 8 year stint as Senior Chef at the highly acclaimed Dishoom in London. After a couple of chef roles locally, the opportunity arose to take over Fajitas at Moreton Cross — a Mexican restaurant that had failed due to a 0 Star hygiene rating.



Despite the previous bad reputation,
Jeevan has turned the restaurant around
— rebranding it as Piri Siri, achieving a 5
Star hygiene rating and collecting almost
500 5 Star reviews across all platforms
within a year. Piri Siri is open 7 days a week

and offers fun, colourful Mexican food from classics such as burritos, tacos and chimichangas to steaks and specials such as lamb chops, swordfish and seabass.



The success of Jeevan's first restaurant and overcoming the odds is testament to his determination. Having fled his home country in 2001 during the brutal conflict in Nepal, he obtained a Diploma in Hotel Management and trained as a chef in India before going on to work at the likes of The Radisson in Dubai and top restaurants in London — whilst always carrying the dream of opening his own restaurant.



Jeevan explained: "I had so many happy memories as a child in Nepal — I could see the Himalayas from my bedroom window and I'd play cricket. I used to help my mother cook using fresh herbs and spices and this is where I developed my passion for cooking. It was such a beautiful life until the civil war started whilst I was doing my GCSEs and they made me join the army at 15."



He continued: "The Nepalese Civil War hasn't been documented much in the West but it was as bad as war gets — my friends died, unspeakable things happened and there was a constant threat of death. I was one of the lucky ones who managed to escape to India and that experience made me realise that life is precious so I followed my passion of working with food — always dreaming of having my own restaurant."

Jeevan plied his trade with top chefs internationally and mastered various cuisines — falling in love with Mexican food and using his knowledge of herbs and spices from back home to put his own unique twists on the dishes. After working in Dubai and then many years in London, he finally settled in Wirral and when Fajitas in Moreton became available fate took its hold and Piri Siri was born.



Jeevan said: "Moving to Wirral is the best thing that could have happened to me — my wife and kids love it here and we are now proper Wirralians. To have my own restaurant has always been my dream and when this came up in 2022 I jumped at the chance — I decided to call it Piri Siri after my daughters Pirity and Siristy. It has been a big gamble to take it on but the customer reviews make it all worth while!"

The Magazine Hotel is a Grade II Listed pub oozing with character and cosy little snugs. Today it offers quality home cooked food, a fine selection of beers and ales, live music, beer and cider festivals, darts and a gem of a garden to the rear. Steve started out as Head Barman in 1998 and since becoming landlord in 2012 the pub has won a whole host of awards.



Nestled away in a beautiful pocket of New Brighton on Magazine Brow overlooking the banks of The Mersey, the pub has won awards such as CAMRA'S Pub Of The Year six times and has been featured in The Good Beer Guide. One of the region's most loved pubs, its recent success is thanks to the efforts of a landlord whose passion is unrivalled.

Steve explained: "I've just turned 50 and have now spent exactly half of my life at this pub. It has seen me as a young lad turn into a family man and there have been so many memories over the years. We have low ceilings with original beams and back in the day the rooms were filled with smoke and interesting characters — so much has changed since then although we still get some interesting characters haha!"

He continued: "After working here for 14 years, I took over the lease from Linda Hughes and have kept it as a traditional pub whilst taking it into the 21st Century. I've installed clear windows to see the river view, landscaped the garden, introduced award winning ales and ciders, background music, live music at weekends, mini festivals, a darts team and regular food. It really is a labour of love for me."

He continued: "The current brewery, Mitchel & Butler, has been great and they have trusted my experience — giving me lots of freedom. The good relationship has been important as running a pub is so tough these days. Our relationship with the local community is also so important and the likes of The Magazine Bowling Club, founded in 1853, helps support us year round."

The scariest moment was the fire — it was caused by a faulty electrical wire and fortunately it just singed some of the beams before we caught it. Oh and as to the answer to your other question — yes it is haunted by a little girl."

We recently had the pleasure of interviewing legendary drummer Clem Burke ahead of his huge Cavern Club gig with The Tearaways on Thursday 30th November. Widely regarded as one of the best drummers of all time, his eye-watering career has seen his achieve success of the highest order with Blondie, whilst also performing with The Ramones, David Bowie, Bob Dylan and Iggy Pop to name a few.

A true force of nature, Clem effortlessly embarks upon multiple projects and side projects — from receiving honorary doctorates for his research on the physical and mental-health benefits of drumming to performing in multiple bands at the same time. We talked to him about The Tearaways, returning to Liverpool and his illustrious career....



LVL: First of all, how are you and what have you been up to?

CLEM: I've just arrived in Liverpool after doing a gig in Bristol with The Tearaways, seeing my friend Fred Armisen perform in Brighton as part of his UK tour and then London. I travelled with my mates Andy and Debbie Harris who have a band called Bootleg Blondie and we're in the middle of creating a big rock opera with 40 songs called The Big Smoke.



LVL: So, you're playing at the iconic Cavern Club with The Tearaways this Thursday. What can we expect on the night?

CLEM: We'll be showcasing our latest album called For Our Next Trick that we produced with our friend Ed Stasium in LA. He's worked with everyone from The Ramones to Talking Heads. If you've not heard us, we're influenced by music of the 60s — The Beatles, The Stones, The Hollies, The Beach Boys.

LVL: When was the last time you played here in Liverpool? Have you played The Cavern Club before?

CLEM: The last time I was here was at The Cavern Club with a group called Lust For

Life that's a homage to the music of Iggy Pop with Katie Puckrik as the frontwoman. Myself, Kevin Armstrong and Glen Matlock from the band have all worked with Iggy. We're playing again at The Cavern Club next year actually. And then of course I did the M&S Bank Arena with Blondie a couple of years ago.



LVL: How have you found the city during your times here? Any stories from your visits here?

CLEM: It's a great city. In fact, it's thanks to Liverpool that I ended up joining The Tearaways. They were performing at Liverpool Beatle Week and needed a drummer so asked me to join them for the gigs — we played at The Cavern Club and The Adelphi. We're all huge Beatles fans and it's great to be back here with them.

LVL: How much of an influence has The Beatles been for you, particularly Ringo as a drummer?

CLEM: Seeing The Beatles on The Ed Sullivan show in the U.S as a kid was incredible — after that television performance the world changed for them and many people. I was about 10 years old and my world changed too. The Beatles made us Americans remember the great rock and roll from the 50s such as Little Richard and so many American musicians were inspired by The Beatles. Similar to what The Stones did, bringing back the likes of Muddy Waters.

As for Ringo, he is one of the greatest rock and roll drummers of all time and again he is an example of taking the sounds of classic session musicians such as Hal Blaine and making it his own. In turn, he has inspired the likes of Max Weinberg of Bruce Springsteen's E Street Band and Dave Grohl. The list goes on and on — Ringo is just the greatest.

LVL: Looking back on your career are there any favourite gigs, memories and moments?

CLEM: There are so many such as playing at The Reichstag outside The Berlin Wall. The opening acts were Tina Turner and Joe Cocker. It was a massive concert and then the wall came down afterwards. The Cavern Club is always so special of course. Working with people such as Bob Dylan and Pete Townshend. Too many to mention.



LVL: What other projects do you have going on at the moment other than Blondie and The Tearaways and what are your plans for 2024?

CLEM: I have several projects. I have a book of memoires coming out, I know that's a little cliche as everyone seems to have a book. It's being published by Collins in the UK and it's coming out this time next year. There's the Rock Opera called The Big Smoke I mentioned with Bootleg Blondie. There's be more Lust For Life gigs next year. Blondie will also be back in the UK next year in June and when our album is released.

I've also been heavily involved in The Clem Burke Drumming Project which is the study of the mental and physical aspects of drumming and what it takes. I've been honoured to received two doctorates, one from Gloucestershire University and one from Chichester University. There are many people involved now and the project goes into schools to work with kids with autism.

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

We can't thank you all enough for putting on a great night in our Peter's memory. It's amazing what you all do for the homeless. You're all heroes!"



A Wirral pub has been transformed into a thriving community space that offers a wide range of services to local people. Since taking ownership of The Rose & Crown in Poulton in November 2022, former Merseyside Woman Of The Year Michelle Leatham has completely turned the pub around.



The Rose & Crown is still a traditional pub although it has been subject to a refurbishment and now has two pool tables and a big screen showing all live sport. There's now food, regular live music featuring the likes of X Factor's Anthony Russell, bingo, quizzes, huge community events and pool and darts teams that have won leagues.



What makes the pub unique, however, is the amazing community outreach that it offers. After 12 months of hard work and collaborations with Wirral Council and Stars & Bars Pubs, the pub is now a community hub and CIC that bridges gaps in the local community in a huge way.



For the past year, the pub has been offering a social supermarket twice a week, coach trips and days out for children to places such as Gulliver's World, £1 meals for children, after school clubs, free Christmas hampers and more. The pub also offers free venue hire for special occasions and is an official 'Warm Space' for people to seek refuge and save on their energy bills.



Michelle Leatham said: "It's been a lot of hard work this past year — from refurbishing the pub to all the events and community projects — but everyone has been on board and I've had great support from the council, the brewery and the local community. Everyone has chipped in, from The Prince's Trust helping improve the courtyard to regulars helping organise events."

She continued: "I previously ran Building Bridges CIC and when I took this pub on in 2022 the idea was always to transform it into a community hub. I wanted to change the way a pub is seen in the local community — not just a place to drink and socialise but somewhere that can have a real impact on the area and people around it."



The feedback from locals has been overwhelming, with many saying it's transformed the area. The social enterprise has made such an impression that it has been selected for filming by ITV for Jane McDonald's Christmas Carol and with Coronation Street star Jodie Prenger — with Anthony Russell to return on 8th December for a free Christmas Appeal event which will see big raffles.



One of the locals, Paul Hunter, said: "Michelle has totally turned the pub around and the community is back together — there's a real sense of togetherness now. The pub does a lot for the community are there are a lot more events — it's really great to see and great for the area."



After a thoroughly successful 12 months in charge, Michelle has further plans for the pub to benefit the local community — introducing holistic therapy services and mental health groups. The idea is to be far more than just a pub and fill the gaps where the cost of living, poverty, mental health issues and crime are all on the rise.



Michelle said: "This Christmas will be particularly hard for many, so we're offering things such as an Elf Disco and Breakfast With Santa for the kids at a really low cost, £1 kids meals, free Christmas hampers and free Christmas dinners. Then in the new year I want to take things to the next level and have more wellbeing and support groups on offer for people."

Laura Alejandra, 31, met her husband Sam Johnson whilst they were both working in Gran Canaria and has now relocated to his Wirral hometown where she has opened the most incredible bakery!

Laura's beautiful creations from her quaint little shop have gone down a storm in Wirral, fulfilling her childhood dream. Laura was raised in Tolima, Colombia, and as a small child she would watch her father and grandmother bake cakes — cracking the eggs for them and praying for them to come out of the oven.

Laura explained: "It's funny when you look back at your childhood and see how life moulded you. Some of my happiest moments were getting involved in cake making with my father and grandmother, and then my mother taught me everything about hard work and business, so it put me on this path from an early age."



She continued: "My father opened a bakery shop and after my 10 hour day at school I'd go there to learn from Teo — an amazing man who created incredible cakes! After school I went to national college to study cookery and worked through the night baking food that I'd sell to the university and other businesses, before going to Hecansa Culinary School in Las Palmas — and that's when my life changed forever!"

Whilst studying in Gran Canaria, Laura met Sam Johnson at the international church, where they were volunteers working with the youth. Initially unable to speak each others' languages, they used Google Translate to communicate but soon fell head over heels with each other and the rest, as they say, is history.

Laura explained: "We completely fell for each other and soon Sam asked my father for his blessing to marry me. We had a beautiful bi-lingual wedding in Gran Canaria and our families met each other for the first time. When Sam had to return to the UK we spent most of our savings to get me a Visa to follow him — however that turned into a



nightmare."

Laura ended up having to wait for months for her Visa to be approved, putting her new life in Wirral on hold and leaving her in limbo in Spain with lots of worries. She pined for her new husband until finally she arrived at Manchester Airport on Christmas Eve 2019 — to the biggest hug from the love of her life.



Laura explained: "That moment at the airport was one I will never forget and our hug was the biggest we'd ever had. I was so happy to be in the UK with my love and settle in but then of course lockdowns started just a few months later, so my integration into the UK was not easy." She continued: "As soon as I could get out socialising I learnt how kind the people are here. Members from our church donated us furniture for our new home and I was welcomed by all the locals. I got a job working at a local coffee shop and there I got to meet so many wonderful local people."

Laura perfected the English language, did a Masters in Developing Businesses and began to engage in outreach work helping refugees and working with Street Safe to support prostitutes — all whilst working in the coffee shop. Then, in November 2022, her childhood dream became true when a small commercial unit became available on Market Street.

Laura said: "We didn't have much money but we were able to get a small loan from my parents and members from our church helped us. Our friends Andy, Ben, Craig and others all gave their time for free to help refurbish the shop and I can honestly say that the people here are the kindest I've ever met anywhere. I recruited two amazing girls and patisserie chefs, Nicky and Cay, and we became busy straight away."

Welcome to our quarterly feature from our resident life coach, Linda B! Linda B is a leading international life coach from Iceland and is a LET Communication Consultant, Trauma Resiliency Model expert, Former President of the Icelandic Coaching Federation and Board of Icelandic Women's Business Association.

We met Linda whilst working with global charity, The Unity Of Faiths Foundation, as she was one of their Ambassadors. Linda is an inspiring woman with a wealth of knowledge about social issues and she is also a published author. Her latest book, Book Of All Seasons, is a book of useful life advice and quotes and has been met with critical acclaim globally. Here's her latest La Vida feature....

Should I love myself — isn't that just plain selfish? Self-compassion or self-love is about taking the autopilot off in our lives, setting it in manual gear and starting practicing self-compassion. The main researcher on the effects of self-compassion is DR. Katrin Neff and her website selfcompassion.org is a wealth of interesting information that I encourage you to check out.



Dr. Neff says her researches shows that about 76% of us are more capable of showing empathy to other people than ourselves! It's a terrible result, although of course it's always nice to be able to have empathy with others. 12% said they felt empathy for themselves on a par with others in the same study and 6% said they felt more empathy for themselves than others (probably narcissists).

We are very good at putting ourselves down and using words that we would never use when talking to other people, right? We feel ashamed for not being perfect and for making mistakes. In Iceland we have a saying that "No one will become a Bishop without being beaten up" which probably means that sometimes we have to repeat our mistakes a few times before we become masters at what we are good at. So, stop talking badly to yourself!

Bad self-talk and the criticism that we actually think peps us up in life, says Dr. Neff, has the opposite effect, because in the emotional chaos that is created, we look for our escape response (fight and flight response) and then the brain blocks out the search for solutions at the same time.

When we struggle with our bad feelings they gain wings and have more influence than they should be allowed to have on us, but as soon as we accept them like any other feeling, they become less important and therefore have less detrimental effect on us.

But what is this self-compassion or self-love so mainly about? Self-love is the practice of caring for and appreciating yourself unconditionally. It involves recognizing your worth as an individual, acknowledging your strengths and weaknesses and treating yourself with the same kindness and respect you would give a loved one. So it actually means accepting yourself as you are and embracing your imperfections.



Self-compassion is about being understanding and forgiving of yourself, especially in times of difficulty, mistakes or when you put yourself down in some way. It is the ability to treat yourself with the same warmth and kindness that you would give to a friend in a difficult situation.

Both self-love and self-compassion are important to us because repeated practice of self-kindness increases your self-esteem, reduces the stress and anxiety that often accompanies criticism and our desire for perfection, and ultimately, self-kindness leads to better overall health.

When we feel good, we are better able to make healthy decisions and interact more positively with others. Practicing self-love and self-compassion involves being aware of our thoughts and feelings, challenging negative self-talk, and prioritizing self-care and self-acceptance.

Dr. Kristin Neff, whom I mentioned before, is one of the leading researchers in self-compassion and has conducted extensive research on the subject. Her work has shown that self-compassion is associated with greater emotional well-being, less anxiety and depression, and increased life satisfaction.

A study published in the Journal of Personality and Social Psychology found that individuals with higher levels of self-compassion tend to have better psychological health, including less negative emotions and increased life satisfaction. Research has also shown that self-compassion is associated with increased resilience in the face of life's challenges. People who practice self-compassion tend to recover more quickly from trauma and adversity.



A study in the Journal of Research in Personality found that self-compassion can reduce perfectionism and self-criticism, which are often associated with high levels of stress and anxiety.

And another research has shown that self-compassion can lead to improved relationship satisfaction.


Self-compassion-based interventions have been used in clinical settings to help individuals with various mental health problems. Research has shown that these interventions can be effective in reducing symptoms of depression, anxiety and post-traumatic stress.

Well, now we must see how much it is worth to take care of ourselves and love ourselves and be our best friends, and thus become the best version of ourselves — whole and undivided.



Oh No! Not again it cannot be Chimney stack squashed of that I could see


But alas, oh yes – it's called being a friend Helping a chappie with a sledge hard to land

This amazing story happened in the winter months just before Christmas a few years ago....

Let's call our lady Maddy. Maddy had moved into a flat in Oxton with her boyfriend and cat in the September. While she loved the high ceilings and tree lined driveway her first home offered, she told me she always felt a little uneasy and assumed at the start it was because everything was so new.

Maddy went to bed as normal one evening and as always dozed off quite quickly. She remembers waking with a snap and being unable to move -- the cat usually found slumbering on the bottom of the bed was on the windowsill had her hackles up and her back arched.



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

A 'gem' of a menswear store is helping fight the men's mental health crisis. Nestled behind the hustle and bustle of Lord Street, Cavern Menswear on Harrington Street offers luxury designer clothing from international and local brands and for the past three years has been working with local men's mental health charity, Sean's Place, to help combat the crisis.

Founded in 2004 and celebrating 10 years at Cavern Walks, Cavern Menswear has always led with a supportive ethos. The luxury menswear store has helped many local up and coming designers and giving them their first retail platform has resulted in some huge success stories, such as Tribal Society who now have their own stores in The Met Quarter and Grosvenor Shopping Centre in Chester.



Placing quality local and UK brands alongside well-known international brands such as Missoni and Valentino, Cavern Menswear has brought these brands international success, whilst making men look and feel great in the process. That said, Store Manager John Franklin has become aware of the rise in men's mental health issues and suicides — problems that run far deeper than how we look on the outside.



John explained: "For almost 20 years now we've been making men feel and look good through designer clothing, but we all know that no matter what you wear you can be suffering within. We have become good friends with Debbie who founded Sean's Place, a local men's mental health charity who do amazing work, and she has opened our eyes to the severity of the mental health crisis – especially amongst men."

He continued: "A shocking 13.2% of men are suffering from a mental health disorder and 8% of men in the 16-24 age group have reported self-harm, whilst 3 out of 4 suicides are male. As most of our customers are male, we decided to join forces with Debbie and let our customers know they're not alone and there's support out there if they need it."



The store has supported Sean's Place a fair bit in recent years — donating flooring, security systems and more for their site in Bootle. They are now raising awareness by placing a free Sean's Place flyer in each shopping bag for customers, along with a free copy of La Vida Liverpool positive news magazine.

In addition to this, Cavern Menswear will be helping raise money for a much needed new commercial boiler at Sean's Place with a donation jar in store and a fundraising weekend on Sat 18th and Sun 19th November. There are also plans for a men's mental health fashion show in the new year.



John said: "We've all heard of those cases — the guys who dress well and look like they've got it all yet are fighting internal battles and then it's too late. What we're doing is raising awareness and letting people know there's help out there can be the difference. That's why we always prefer people to come in store rather than shop online — talking and face to face interaction is so important these days."

An unlikely partnership, Cavern Menswear provides men with high end clothing to look the part, whereas Sean's Place helps men who are suffering — with the aim of ending the stigma and encouraging them to talk. The multi-award winning charity based in Bootle offers free support in a confidential and non-clinical environment — with early intervention the key.



Debbie, Founder of Sean's Place, said: "As a small local charity, support like this is so important for the vital work we do. During the past three years, Cavern Menswear have supported us a great deal such as paying for all the new flooring in our new centre and a security system and CCTV, as well as donating fishing equipment and musical instruments for our music room." She continued: "This type of support is

helping our mission to combat the rising men's mental health problems and it speaks volumes about the great sense of community in Liverpool. Collaboration is key and when we work together like this we really can bring about positive change."



John summarised: "Clothing can make us feel like a million dollars but if we're really troubled inside it doesn't matter what we wear. We've always had an ethical approach, especially when it comes to supporting local designers and getting them to the next level, but with what's going on in society it's time to start raising more awareness."

Cavern Menswear is located on Harrington Street — a few doors down from Roxy Ballroom — and offers luxury designer menswear from local and international brands. Sean's Place is a multi-award winning men's mental health charity based in Bootle that offers free support and advice in a non-clinical environment.

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

Back in July my trusty friend Dave and I embarked upon an epic 3 day tour of North Wales courtesy of Wirral's Stargazers Campervan Hire. We took out their luxury VW T28 campervan and explored some of the stunning countryside and coast just over the border from us!



About Stargazers

The Campervan

Dave an I enjoyed some time at the incredible hotel and explored the stunning environment before heading to a campsite just outside Bala town centre. We set up the beds in the campervan to avoid having to do it after a few too many drinks and headed into the town for a hearty dinner and drinks at a few of the high street pubs.



Betws-y-Coed & Porthmadog

On Day 2 we headed to Betws-y-Coed — the picturesque little village in Snowdonia National Park surrounded by forests, mountains and lakes. We met up with our good friend Mark and his family before being joined by Dave's girlfriend Becky for a hike. Either side of the village there are epic hikes through the forestry up to the lakes and we opted to explore Llyn y Parc (Llyn Elsi is also highly recommended).



After a fantastic day in Betws-y-Coed, we went on to the coastal town of Porthmadog — where we stayed at another great little campsite and went out for an Indian and a few drinks at Yr Awstralia pub. Two years prior I cycled around Wales for men's mental health and stopped off at that pub, where I met an old guy named Malcolm. When we visited, guess who was there at the bar? Great to see you again, Malcolm!



Portmeirion & Abersoch

The next morning we enjoyed breakfast in Portmadog with my friend Georgina Tang and her son Alessio before heading to the iconic Portmeirion Village. If you've not yet been it's a must — a stunning destination with colourful buildings akin to the Italian Amalfi Coast. It's where the classic television programme The Prisoner was filmed and we explored the village, coast and woodland trails.



This was the final day of our mini adventure so we decided to finish at the Llyn peninsula's popular watersports destination of Abersoch. The Llyn peninsula is home to some stunning beaches and coves and the famous Ty Coch pub — voted 3rd best beach bar in the world. We enjoyed Abersoch beach and a couple of great pubs on our final night before heading home via Llandudno the following day.

A very special thing has been happening at a Wirral rugby club. Prenton RUFC have become a charity — revolutionising the role of a rugby club in today's society — and their Prenton RUFC Community Hub offers kids clubs, fundraising and community events, a community garden and more.



The club has become 'more than just a rugby club' and has filled a gap in society for the local community and beyond. The club's aim is to use rugby as a tool to combat issues such as obesity, mental health problems and isolation, whilst acting as a hub in response to the closure of the local library, community centre, youth club, pub and playing fields.



During the past 12 months, the club has hosted free activity camps for children — with fun educational games and teaching them about gardening and nutrition. The club pioneered a Eurovision gardening project for Ukraine, has provided space for groups and organisations and works with the Community Payback team.



On Saturday 2nd September, Prenton hosted the inaugural Doddie Day for the My Name'5 Doddie Foundation in memory of rugby legend Doddie Weir. The huge tartan takeover featured a wide range of activities such as The Highland Games For Kids, Tag Rugby For Kids, a Tug Of War competition, juggling lessons, an airsoft shooting range, raffles and more — raising over £15,000 for motor neurone disease.



The Doddie Day was so successful that it received support from international rugby figures such as Leilani Latu and Andy Craig — proving that rugby is a powerful vehicle and a club can indeed be #morethanjustarugbyclub. The day featured a tartan suit in memory of Doddie Weir, which is now travelling around other clubs who are doing the same for the My Name'5 Doddie Foundation.



Prenton's Gordon Knapman said: "Prenton Rugby Club is an example of how a sports organisation can make a positive impact on the local community and beyond. For more than three decades, the club has been offering not only rugby training and matches but also a range of social and environmental initiatives that benefit the residents of the Prenton estate and beyond."

He continued: "The club has created a community garden and nature footpaths and we teach young people nature skills. We provide clothing and well-being activities for people of all ages and work with the community payback team, as well as providing a space for other charities and organisations to host events. We are bound by the bonds of rugby and through the sport we can truly make a difference."



The club is now working with Wirral Borough Council, Sport England, the RFU and other organisations to build on this — to develop the site and create a state of the art hub that will be able to take things to the next level. The club is aiming to offer better facilities, an on site gym and more — to build a flagship hub that can act as a model for other clubs around the country.



Prenton's Brian Elkerton said: "We're facing problems in society with an increase in mental health issues, isolation, poverty and suicide. We're also seeing an increase in obesity and a decrease in sport participation — rugby participation is down a shocking 67% for example. With many community meeting places closing and a lack of things for people to do, these issues are getting worse."

He continued: "At Prenton we aim to bridge that gap and have been doing lots of things to bring the community together — whether that's through rugby or community events. We have some exciting plans in the pipeline and with the right funding we can offer so much more and hopefully make this rugby club a blueprint for clubs around the country."

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
