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

Ran by Karen Bullen and her team, this iconic venue has become far more than a place to eat or drink. It is a thriving community hub filled with warmth, friendship, creativity and purpose. In 2026, The Clock Face is set to become an even greater lifeline for local people — introducing Together Tuesday entertainment afternoons for pensioners on Tuesdays and community coach trips with a difference.



A Pub with History — and a Heart for the Future

Once the residence of Lord Derby, The Clock Face carries the charm and character of its heritage, standing proudly as one of Prescot's most recognisable historic buildings. When Karen and the team took it over six years ago, she embarked on a significant refurbishment — not just restoring the building, but restoring its place in the community. Despite being located on a main road and 'down the

hill' from the heart of Prescot, the pub is thriving. And that success has little to do with chance. It comes from the forward-thinking of Karen and her daughter Linzi, with their unwavering belief in the power of community spaces to change lives.

Food, Music and Friendship — A Place for Everyone



The Clock Face offers quality home-cooked food seven days a week, drawing visitors from all over the region. Do check out their homemade pastry pies — with minted lamb, creamy chicken with leek and gammon or steak and Thwaites ale choices — and they're often fully booked for Sunday roasts. Afternoon tea is also a big hit, as are themed bottomless brunch events.



At weekends, the pub offers quality live music, making it a lively and welcoming space for families, friends and music lovers alike. Upstairs, it offers sumptuously decorated cosy rooms. But what truly makes The Clock Face special is what happens between the meals, the music and the pints.

Events That Make a Difference

On Thursday afternoons, the Knit & Natter group offers a warm refuge from the cold winter and a chance to connect with others and there's a weekly quiz. During the summer months you'll find 'lbiza Chill' afternoons with a Cafe Del Mar vibe in the carpark, whilst there are various seasonal events such as Christmas and Easter activities.



Throughout the year, there are pop up markets in the carpark showcasing local independents and events such as wine tasting evenings and cutest dog competitions. The pub also offers free venue hire — with a sectioned off room for special occasions and of course, gorgeous rooms upstairs for guests who have travelled.



New for 2026: Two Incredible Community Initiatives

2026 will see The Clock Face launch two groundbreaking community offerings. Every Tuesday from 1pm until 3pm, starting 6th January, Together Tuesday offers older people free entertainment — from vintage and jazz singers to historians and talks. The Tuesday afternoon includes the offer of a delicious 2 course meal for just £9.95 — all set in a safe, warm, welcoming space.

The Clock Face recently hosted a Community Coach Trip to York — for just £25, people enjoyed a breakfast roll at the pub, a day out to York with return travel and a party back at the pub upon return. The feedback was that good they've already planned more for 2026 — with a trip to Bury Markets on Saturday 31st January for just £25, including a breakfast roll, tea and coffee before leaving and a party upon return.

More Than a Pub

Landlady Karen Bullen said: "We've created something really special here and we're definitely more than a pub. There's always something going on and we have a jam packed schedule of events and community initiatives. With loneliness, isolation and mental health all issues today, as well as financial hardship, we've designed ongoing, affordable activities and initiatives in a time when community spirit is so important."

She continued: "We already have older people coming in for Knit & Natter, or just for a respite and some company, but Together Tuesday will take this to the next level — we're even going to offer educational and safety talks from the likes of the police. Our first coach trip was an incredible success too and the feedback has been amazing — we can't wait for more adventures for the community in 2026!"



The Beating Heart of Prescot

In an era where loneliness is rising and community spaces are disappearing, The Clock Face stands as a shining example of what a pub should be — a place that enriches people's lives, fosters connection and brings joy to the everyday. 

Head Chef Ali Kavlak is a magician in the kitchen and has cooked for the world leaders at the Turkish Embassy during his career. My cousin Ibrahim and everyone at Casa Rima, it is a team effort. 
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

It's 2018 and Victoria Road in New Brighton feels dilapidated and depressed. A number of commercial properties are empty, whilst the pubs are overlooked by day-trippers headed to the promenade down the hill. New Brighton was no longer the booming seaside resort of yesteryear and as the big chains created a corporate utopia down on the front, Victoria Road remained a forgotten victim of the town's decline.



But then a revolution happened. Local visionary and fire starter Dan Davies decided to make a stand. After years of success in the alcohol licencing industry, instead of choosing to live lavishly he decided to put all his money, time and effort into his hometown. Fuelled by his frustration towards how New Brighton had regressed from being one of the UK's most thriving resorts, he took action.



It started with street art — employing local and internationally renowned artists to breathe colour and life into the underdog that was Victoria Road. Estate agents became art galleries, old banks became bars and boarded up buildings became eateries. The Victoria Quarter was born. As the project gathered pace, a unique eco-system of independent businesses developed and a new sense of community was instilled.



Today, almost eight years after Dan's mission to spark an independent revival in his hometown, Victoria Road is a thriving hotspot of colour, character and community. Countless good times have been enjoyed, new friendships formed and a deep sense of pride has become unbreakable — as we stand together in defiance whilst the tyrants that run the country try to break us down.



If you're visiting Victoria Road for the day, there are some great options for breakfast or brunch. Becky's Brekky offers incredible value hearty breakfasts, whilst a couple of doors down the super cool Social 114 is more of an avocado on sourdough bread kind of vibe. Meanwhile, Paula's Smuggler's Cave cafe sits somewhere in the middle and has won an award. All three are great choices to get your day started.



If craft beer is your thing and you're looking for some alternative beverages, The Bow Legged Beagle and Home Brew Tap both provide a welcoming atmosphere and every kind of beer, ale, stout and cider imaginable! During the summer months they become rather continental — with connoisseurs sat outside, enjoying their drink of choice whilst basking in the rays.



There are some cracking pubs on Victoria Road! The Perch Rock and The Harbour must be given huge respect as these charismatic venues have been standing strong on Victoria Road long before the Victoria Quarter was a thing. Standing the test of time, both The Perch Rock and The Harbour are legendary amongst locals and laughs are guaranteed!



New Brighton Hotel Bar & Lounge has also been a long-standing feature on Victoria Road and it has evolved into a top destination alongside the street's vibrant new energy. The stylish venue offers great food and drinks, live sport, live music, venue hire and a hotel upstairs if you fancy staying making it a proper seaside break. Just over the road you'll find The Olive Tree — a restaurant offering quality cuisine.



Dan's flagship venue back in 2018 was The James Atherton — a modern tavern named after the man who founded New Brighton in the 1800s. The 'JA' is a great destination for a good pint and live sport, whilst you'll likely find it booming with great tunes on Friday and Saturday nights. In an act of defiance against the government, Dan made this pub famous by renaming it The Three Bellends and The Two Helmets during Covid and then The George Orwell in response to Digital ID.



His other venue, Rockpoint Records, is the epitome of what The Victoria Quarter is about. With stripped back brick walls, graffiti and a soundtrack to match, Rockpoint Records is a cool coffee shop by day and a vibrant hotspot by night. Some of the best solo artists in the region perform at weekends and it's also home to Hella Dough, whose wood fired pizzas are the best in Wirral according to many reviews!



Riptide next door is the latest addition to the street — a vibrant bar with live music that also offers pool and darts on the second floor. Riptide's large events space to the rear has already hosted some incredible gigs — with the likes of Space and Headfeeder putting on sold-out gigs. Riptide stays true to Victoria Road's independent ethos and also its creativity — with art displayed on the walls.



Victoria Road, with all its colourful street art and colourful characters, has become somewhat bohemian and this has attracted Hatch art gallery and exhibition space. Meanwhile, its neighbour District House is an 'art deli bar' that offers retro art, artisan food and premium drinks — owned by music legend Jayne Casey, the vibe is on point and the DJ nights are off the scale!



Speaking of which, a visit to Victoria Road isn't complete without experiencing Tallulah's Emporium — a quirky off-the-wall hangout that hosts funky vinyl DJ nights and some of the finest jazz musicians in the region. Check out their imaginative cocktail list, including their intriguing range of Old Fashioned twists, and get your groove on to music of the highest order!



Thanks to Dan Davies' vision some eight years ago, Victoria Road has been revived and transformed into a vibrant destination — indeed, huge public events and mini festivals have taken place on the street, with thousands of people in attendance. Dan has battled cancer and financial struggles in recent times, yet the concept and community he has built stands strong.



Finally, whilst this is a feature about Victoria Road's revival, let's not forget all the other fantastic businesses that have been working hard to make New Brighton a go-to destination once again. You'll find gems by the train station, off the beaten track, on the promenade, on Magazine Lane, Seabank Road and further up on Rake Lane, Telegraph Road and Albion Street — too many to mention, but I urge you to explore!



New Brighton is a truly amazing place to live and I encourage anyone to visit. Once one of the UK's most popular seaside holiday resorts, it became run down — but it's fighting back! With the promenade, beach and captivating views over to Liverpool, beautiful parks, a cinema, theatre, loads of fun things to do, so many incredible places to eat and drink and a strong sense of community, it's safe to say New Brighton is most definitely back on the map!



Award winning guitarist Martin Taylor MBE has established a unique musical career as an internationally acclaimed musician, and his inimitable style has seen him recognized as the world's foremost exponent of solo jazz guitar playing.

As well as being a true guitar innovator, he is also a master concert performer, dazzling audiences with his solo shows, which combine virtuosity, emotion, humour, with a strong stage presence. 

In this La Vida Liverpool exclusive, we talk to Atomic Kitten star Natasha Hamilton about her solo career, her new record label, Morpho Records, and the importance of supporting young artists and mental health in the industry. La Vida owner Justin Hopper hosted the big Christmas tree switch on in Liscard with Natasha and what a lovely lady she is!



LA VIDA: So, how are you and what have you been up to recently, apart from the big Liscard Christmas event of course!

NATASHA: I'm really good! Life is full, creative, and moving fast, which is exactly how I like it. I'm spending a lot of time in the studio at the moment working on my solo music, and I feel the most connected to my artistry I've been in years. Alongside that, launching Morpho Records has opened up a whole new dimension of my career. It's been a beautiful mix of building, creating, learning, and leading.

LA VIDA: Tell us about your recent solo music and the debut EP!

NATASHA: This new music feels like a complete rebirth for me. The EP explores a journey through darkness, surrender, awakening, and stepping into your power again. It's the most honest work I've ever made – vocally, lyrically, emotionally. There's a rawness to it, but also a clarity and strength that comes from everything I've lived through. It marks a new era for me, one where I'm not just singing a story, I'm owning it!

LA VIDA: And this record label, what's that all about?

NATASHA: Morpho Records is a dynamic new label focused on the development of future pop stars and is a continuation of the home I had as a young artist. I was signed to a label who felt like family and that's what I wanted with Morpho. It's a future-focused, artist-first label built around creativity, nurture, and genuine care. I wanted to create a place where artists feel heard and empowered. Not rushed, moulded or treated like a product.

LA VIDA: What are you offering artists?

NATASHA: Real support. Development. Honest guidance. A space where their individuality isn't just accepted but celebrated. We work closely with artists to understand who they are, what they want to say, and how they want to say it – creatively, visually, strategically. It's about building sustainable careers, not quick wins. And because I've lived the highs and the hard lessons myself, I bring a perspective that's grounded in experience.

LA VIDA: What does it mean to you to give rising artists an opportunity through your label and connections?

NATASHA: It means everything. I know how it feels to be young, talented, and hungry, but unsure where to turn or who to trust. To be in a position now where I can open doors for others is a privilege. Helping an artist step into their potential, protecting them, guiding them, and watching them grow, it's one of the most fulfilling things I've ever done.




LA VIDA: Do you think it's more difficult for talent to come through today compared to when you started?

NATASHA: In some ways yes, in some ways no. There are more opportunities than ever, but there's also far more noise. The pressure to be constantly visible, constantly "on," can be overwhelming. When I started, the path was narrower but clearer. Now the path is wide open, which is exciting – but artists can feel lost in it. That's where the right support system makes all the difference.

LA VIDA: What was it like for you as a young teenage artist from Kensington suddenly becoming a big star?

NATASHA: Surreal. Thrilling. Intense. I was just a girl from Liverpool who loved to sing, and suddenly my whole world changed overnight. I didn't fully understand the scale of what was happening at the time, you can't at that age. It was incredible, but it also came with pressures I wasn't prepared for. Those early experiences shaped me, and they're a big part of why I care so deeply about supporting young talent now.



LA VIDA: Do you think enough is done to protect artists from the impact of fame on mental health?


NATASHA: Not yet. The industry has improved, but there's still a long way to go. Fame amplifies everything, the good and the painful and without the right support, it can become overwhelming very quickly. Young artists especially need safeguarding, education, and people around them who aren't afraid to have the difficult conversations. Protecting mental health should be as fundamental as vocal coaching or rehearsal time.

LA VIDA: What are your most memorable and proud moments with Atomic Kitten?

NATASHA: There are so many. Hearing our songs sung back to us around the world. Topping charts in countries I'd never even visited. The sisterhood, the madness, the laughter. But the proudest part for me is how those songs have lived on. Even now, new generations are discovering them. That's a rare gift – and I don't take it for granted.

LA VIDA: Any advice for young artists coming through? Or warnings about the industry?

NATASHA: Know who you are before anyone else tries to tell you. Protect your voice – not just your singing voice, but your inner voice. Surround yourself with people who genuinely care about you, not just what you can do for them. Learn the business. Trust your instincts. And understand that longevity isn't about being the loudest in the room, it's about being the truest to yourself.




LA VIDA: What are you hoping to achieve with the label, and how can artists reach you?

NATASHA: Morpho Records is about building a new generation of Pop artists who are brave, self-aware, imaginative, and supported properly. I want to help create careers that last, not moments that flash and fade. We're already working with our first signing and will be opening the doors for more very soon. We're always listening for authentic voices. Any Pop artists who feel Morpho might be the right home for them can share their music with our talent scout Ross, who leads our A&R scouting email ross@morpho-records. com

When Belle steps onto a stage, she brings with her more than an ancient Chinese instrument — she brings a living, breathing bridge between cultures. The Hong Kong-raised guzheng player, whose real name is Erin Lam, has become one of the UK's most exciting new artists, blending tradition with bold creativity.

In September 2025, she stunned audiences at Manchester's huge Primal Live song contest, winning Best Original Song and Top Fundraiser, raising thousands for the Booth Centre supporting the homeless. But her success is more than a musical milestone. It marks a deeply personal journey — one shaped by loss, rediscovery and an unbreakable connection to her roots.



A Mother's Legacy

Belle's incredible song contest win is dedicated to her mother. Belle lost her mother to blood cancer in 2015, after a year-long battle following her 2014 diagnosis, and was sadly unable to witness Belle's success — from reaching Grade 8 on the piano and completing her Music Masters at the University of Manchester to winning Primal Live.

Speaking of this, she says: "My mother was a great, elegant and kind woman. She raised seven children, and I am the fifth. Because my father was often away for business, it was always her and us — we shared a very close bond. It saddens me that she cannot see my achievements but she is always with me everything I do is in her honour."



A Journey With The Guzheng

With Grade 8 piano already under her belt, Belle sought something that would connect her to her heritage. The guzheng — an ancient Chinese zither with a history spanning over 2,500 years — captivated her instantly. "I fell in love with its shimmering, expressive sound and the graceful movements of the player," she explains.

The guzheng is a traditional Chinese string instrument with 21 or more strings, which has thousands of years of history. The origin of the instrument dates back to the Spring and Autumn (770-476 BCE) and Warring States periods (475-221 BCE). However, the string instrument did not become prominent until the Qin Dynasty (210-206 BCE).



What began as a new challenge became a calling. More than ten years later, the guzheng is now her profession and platform for innovation. Belle is boldly pushing the instrument into new spaces — covering Western songs, experimenting with modern genres and collaborating with UK artists. Her recent groundbreaking project with Liverpool singer Sophie Mac — Redemption — features the guzheng as the lead instrument in a rap song.



The Day Belle Made Guzheng Famous!

On Sunday 21st September 2025, Belle competed at the huge Primal Live song contest alongside 35 other musicians and bands — a competition that was oozing with talent. In a packed and lively event at Band On The Wall, Belle silenced the fervent crowd with her spinetingling performances that blew the audience away — raising hairs and creating goosebumps in the process.

Belle's first ever original composition — Emerging — is an instrumental story of transformation. It mirrors her own journey: moving from darkness to light, from doubt to renewal. Its structure is unconventional — no chorus, no bridge — just evolving verses that build toward a luminous glissando symbolising rebirth. She knew instantly that its premiere belonged on the Primal Live stage.

For the final, Belle delivered a Jay Chou martial-arts classic — Fearless. Performing in a custom qipao, she honoured both her heritage and her family — who share a deep love of Jay Chou's music. Her guzheng technique became almost percussive, driving the song with sweeping gestures and explosive energy. "It captures the martial arts spirit — staying true to yourself and turning fear into strength," she explains.



What Next For The Forward-thinking Virtuoso?

By winning Primal Live song contest, Belle has broken down cultural boundaries and made history. But what now for the forward-thinking virtuoso? Belle is now focused on expanding her musical footprint in the UK — through performances, collaborations and creating more original music. She is soon to release Redemption — the groundbreaking guzheng rap song with Sophie Mac that might well be the first collaboration of its kind.

Belle is also looking to work with venues to bring something unique to events, theatres who want a stunning showcase and also schools and organisations who wish to learn about the cultural significance of the instrument. 
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Just months after picking up his first guitar, 28-yearold John Roche from Huyton has taken home the top prize at this year's Primal Live song contest, a major music event supporting local charity The Whitechapel Centre. The talented country artist has been tipped for big things after blowing the audience and judges away.

Held on Saturday 25th October at the Invisible Wind Factory, the event featured 36 artists and bands and raised over £5,000 for the Liverpool homelessness charity. But it was Roche's heartfelt performance and raw songwriting that stole the show — and the hearts of everyone in the room — as the hundreds of people in attendance were mesmerised by his stunning songs.



John's journey into music began less than a year ago. What started as nervous posts of himself singing on social media soon turned into a passion he couldn't ignore. In June, he began writing his own songs, and by September, he'd bought his first guitar. Just two months later, he stood on stage at Primal Live — performing live for the very first time.

Despite his inexperience, Roche captivated the audience with two original songs, "All That I Need" and "Weekend Dad." His emotional delivery and storytelling earned a standing ovation and glowing praise from the judging panel, fellow performers and the crowd alike — with people singing along with him to All That I Need during his celebration performance at the end.

The victory marks a remarkable turnaround for John, who admits that just a year ago, he was struggling with depression, low confidence and uncertainty about his future. "I didn't really know what I wanted to do with my life," John said. "I was in and out of jobs, feeling lost. Then I started singing online, and something just clicked. Music gave me purpose again — it helped me through some really dark times."

His first song, "All That I Need," was born out of heartbreak and written as a form of self-healing. That creative spark quickly grew into a passion — John has now written ten songs, with "All That I Need" and "Weekend Dad" being his first completed works. Though still unreleased, John plans to record and release "All That I Need" in the new year, with hopes that his music will bring comfort to others facing tough times.

Compared by many to country and folk-inspired artists like Luke Combs, Zach Bryan, and Noah Kahan, Roche's sound blends emotional honesty with relatable storytelling. But for John, success isn't just about the music — it's about connection. "My goal now is to make music people can really relate to," he said. "If my songs can help someone else the way music helped me, that's all I could ever ask for."

From battling depression and self-doubt to winning Primal Live in his first ever live performance, John Roche's story is one of courage, resilience and the transformative power of music — proving that sometimes, the hardest beginnings lead to the brightest stages. Keep your eyes peeled, as the next big Liverpool star is well and truly in the making.



The event was another incredible showcase from Primal Live -- with some top talent on display. A special shout out must also go to Autumn B Woods -- who overcame adversities and homelessness to win Best Performance of the song contest. Her victory epitomises everything Primal Live is about, as the team gear up for another big event in March 2026.

FRED'S STORY

I try to get into the café on Green Lane every day; you meet a lot of characters there, so-ya-do. Today it was Fred's turn to talk to me, to tell his story.

Now I've been dodging people like Fred because I'm no longer in the random story-collecting business, no longer taking on drive-by stories. Stories are not required from others at this time, thank you very much. I'm trying to reduce my empathy, because empathy can be draining, and if not regulated – toxic even. But today, when there was only me, Fred, and Bobby (the café owner) there, and Fred said that his mum had died yesterday, and looked like he needed to tell a story, I very reluctantly came out of retirement.

Back story: I've been pestering Petrol Bomb Pete from the café to let me write his biography for a few years now. I've even offered him money for it, and a promise to only publish it posthumously, because I feel it's such an interesting tale. Peter won't give it up, but I keep making the offer anyway, hoping that he will, and Fred must have overheard these exchanges.

Fred said today, "You write stories on people's lives, don't you?" He then explained how he'd heard me asking Peter if I could write his biography. Fred said he wanted to make a book out of his life because he's pretty much skint and needs the money. I said I wasn't really interested in writing his story – but Fred was starting to tell it anyway. He was eager to reveal his life to me, and as I said, his mum had died the day before, which (via decency) warrants him a little grace, so here the three of us find ourselves, witnessing the unravelling of Fred's story.

At the time this story is unfolding, I'm alone at my own table wiring together some lights for Petrol Bomb Pete's flat; Bob is in and out of the kitchen, and Fred is talking at his own table about five metres away from mine.

Fred's story starts off pretty mundane if I'm honest, and I'm sympathetically giving the appearance of listening, but just vaguely granting grace and space, while not really being emotionally involved in the narrative. He tells me of his love of football and how he loves his dog Rory more than anything in the world – he calls Rory his baby. Fred has this unassuming innocence and child-like manner about him, more suited to a child than a grown man.

He tells how he's always lived around older people and never anyone his own age. Then at one point he says, "And there's obviously this thing", and I hear him double-tap with his hand. Not looking up from my task of wiring the lights, I reply, "What thing?" and he says, "This thing", and taps his upper thigh again under the table.

He then invites me to stand up and look at what he's talking about, and I ruefully tell Fred that I can't be arsed standing up, and that he should just tell me. Just then, a customer enters to collect a takeaway order, and Fred looks across at him and says, "I don't want to say just now, give us a min." I'm guessing he's got a false leg or something and he's a bit embarrassed to say in front of random strangers, so I keep wiring and Fred halts his narration and waits patiently for the guy to leave.

The unknown customer gets his sandwich from Bob and leaves, freeing Bob to come sit down at the table next to Fred. At this point Fred stands up and taps his leg again, revealing a massive lump in his tracksuit bottoms. I'm like, "What's that lump, kid?" and Fred says, "I've got one giant bollock, haven't !!"

So (me being me), with the default setting of laughing in any awkward situation, I just double up in hysterics, don't I.

Then Bob starts laughing, then even Fred starts laughing in turn, because I'm in tears at Fred slapping his giant gonad in the middle of... Bob's café. I manage to compose myself for a second to say, "Is that really your bollock?" with the intention of apologising. But then when Fred says, "Ye, that's my giant bollock", with another double tap on the bollock bongos, and I say, "That's fucking nuts, that!", I realise what I've said... and start howling again.

Eventually the three of us catch our breath, compose ourselves, and a kind of soberness creeps into the moment. A shadow of reverence for Fred's feelings is rightly cast over us.

Fred has our attention at last.

He starts really telling his story. And by then, I've made a cast-iron promise to myself to really listen to Fred, and not to start laughing again, because one thing is quickly becoming apparent: Fred hasn't just got an oversized testicle – he's got an oversized heart, a shedload of stoicism, and the ability to laugh at his own misfortunes. Even on the day after his mum had just died.

Fred said to me today (after we'd all stopped laughing about his bollock) that, "When the going gets tough – the Scousers start laughing." And that's true. It's a very Liverpudlian thing: to assuage and heal awkwardness through laughter. Laughter not at each other – but with each other.

Fred told me one of the saddest life stories I've ever heard today. It was a story of disadvantage, of neglect, of heartache, of bad health, and of often not belonging. He told me how, "We all have our problems, but we need to be kind to each other", because that's how we make the world a better place.

Fred turns up with a smile on his face every day. He shows up for life like we all do – all with different stories, some happy, some sad, some with big balls, some with little balls, some with no balls – but we show up. Fred has the will to try to be happy despite circumstance, and I think in this world, where it's so easy to choose misery and self-pity, that just turning up and smiling despite circumstance is one of the bravest things we can do. And when we're courageous enough to do so, it lights the whole world around us up, and everyone that we touch too.

I felt it happen today.

04 November 2020

So today Bob from the café messaged and said that Fred had died, and it hit me pretty hard. I wondered if maybe he'd just run out of things to live for; wondered if he'd died of a broken heart when his mum, who he lived with, had passed. I wondered if he maybe just wasn't well, and I hoped that he'd gone in his sleep without pain.

I thought about how reluctant I was to give him my time initially, and how important it might have been for him to have Bob and me hold that space for him to tell his tale.

I wondered a lot of things, some poignant, some silly. Then I wondered if he knew. If he was just searching for a place to leave his story with somebody because he, somewhere deep inside himself, knew that he'd not be around to tell it in a week's time. That he'd be going to join the sunsets, and that all of his pain, and hurt, and laughs, and smiles would be just words on a page and memories in our minds.

Night and God bless, Fred. I hope you're born again into a better life, or get to play with Rory on a cloud, or just get to be at peace. I hope the best for you wherever you are, kid.

I hope this goes some way to remembering you properly too.

So today was Fred's funeral. We got word how he died: apparently his heart had just stopped. They found his body sat up in his favourite chair. He was rolling a joint when he passed, and there was an open can of lager next to him. This comforted me to know; I guess that's not a bad way to go out.

Bob had told his friends that before Fred died, he'd passed his life story on to me, and I'd written about him in my journal. Fred didn't get a chance to read it, obviously, but Bob passed it to his friend last week, and just messaged to say that they used it as Fred's eulogy in the funeral service. All his friends said I'd described him perfectly, told his story well, and that it had made them both laugh and cry.

I get now how important what I do is: the listening, the writing. Stories heal people; sometimes stories are all we are.



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
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When it comes to mental health, honesty and humour rarely share the same page. But in Bipolar & I: Dancing with Darkness, Flirting with Fabulous, Wirral author and mental health advocate Kate A. McCann manages to weave both into a refreshingly candid and uplifting book about living with Bipolar Type 2 disorder.




Part memoir, part survival guide, Kate's book is a brutally honest yet ultimately hopeful exploration of life with a condition that affects around one million people in the UK. Through her sharp wit and raw storytelling, she shines a light on the realities of bipolar disorder — not just the darkness of depression or the chaos of hypomania, but the moments of resilience, creativity and sparkle that can coexist with them.



A Journey from Diagnosis to Discovery

In her opening chapter, Journey to the Dreaded Diagnosis: Bipolar Wasn't on My Vision Board, Kate recalls the moment a doctor gave her chaos a name. What follows is a series of deeply personal yet universally relatable reflections on identity, selfworth, and survival.

She personifies her illness as an unruly "moodswinging sidekick," taking readers through the highs and lows in vivid, sometimes hilarious detail. From The States of Kate trilogy, which explores the depths of depression and the dizzying peaks of hypomania, to Pill Pop Princess: Life on Lithium, Kate balances brutal honesty with a disarming sense of humour.



Finding Light in the Mess

While Bipolar & I doesn't shy away from the harder topics — self-harm, alcohol misuse, burnout and anxiety — Kate's tone is never one of defeat. Instead, she reframes survival as an act of everyday heroism. In chapters like Boss Bitch Energy (Even in PJs) and The Magic of Self-Care: Be Your Own Hero (Without a Cape or a Clue), she reminds readers that strength can look like getting out of bed, showing up for yourself or simply taking a nap without guilt.

Her writing style is fun, lighthearted and conversational, often poking fun at herself while offering practical wisdom. Every chapter is laced with empathy and relatability – whether you're living with bipolar, supporting someone who is, or just trying to navigate the rollercoaster of being human.

Creativity as a Lifeline

Kate also celebrates the creative spark that often accompanies bipolar disorder. In Little Old Creative Me, she reflects on how writing became her salvation and how creativity offers both expression and escape. "Many with bipolar are blessed with creative traits," she notes, highlighting how art, words and humour can become tools for healing.



Breaking Stigma Through Storytelling

According to Bipolar UK, the condition affects roughly 1 in 50 people in the UK, yet it remains one of the most misunderstood mental illnesses. Kate's book helps to break that stigma – not through clinical explanations, but through storytelling that is heartfelt, funny and unfiltered.

Her memoir serves as both education and empathy. It reminds readers that mental illness doesn't discriminate – as she puts it, "Same shit, different stain." Whether you're a CEO, a parent or an artist, bipolar can impact anyone, anywhere.



A Voice of Hope and Humour

In the final chapters, particularly Help & Hope: A Hug in Chapter Form, Kate offers compassion and solidarity to those who feel broken or "too much." She writes not as a distant expert, but as a friend who's been through the fire and found her way back — sometimes crawling, sometimes dancing. Her message is simple but powerful: even in the darkest moments, there's always room for light, laughter and fabulousness.



Beyond the Book: Talking About Bipolar

Following the book's successful launch at Liverpool Book Festival, Kate is now offering free talks to businesses, organisations and charities to raise awareness about bipolar disorder and workplace mental health. Through open dialogue, she hopes to help others understand the condition, reduce stigma and inspire compassion in professional and personal spaces alike.



A Must-Read for Everyone

Bipolar & I: Dancing with Darkness, Flirting with Fabulous isn't just for those with bipolar disorder. It's for anyone who has ever felt anxious, exhausted, imperfect, or overwhelmed. Kate's ability to find humour in hardship makes this book a profound, relatable and genuinely enjoyable read. Above all, it's a celebration of survival, self-acceptance, and the messy magic of being human.

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

In this feature, La Vida Liverpool talks to Lord Mayor Of Liverpool Barbara Murray about her role and what she hopes to achieve during her tenure. Much more than just attending events, her role is an important one — with lots of charity initiatives and work for great causes. Here's our exclusive Q&A....



LA VIDA: Firstly, congratulations on your role. How does it feel to be Lord Mayor Of Liverpool?

LORD MAYOR: It's a great privilege and it feels wonderful compared to the working life of a councillor.

LA VIDA: Please tell us more about yourself and your career leading up to this point?

LORD MAYOR: I have had a varied career in the civil service, retail, education and housing which has been useful in political roles and appointments.

LA VIDA: How and why did you become Lord Mayor Of Liverpool?

LORD MAYOR: It is an appointment by the leader of council and was supported by cabinet, Labour group and full council. I believe some of the criteria are length of service, positions held and record as a ward councillor.



LA VIDA: Please tell us more about the role and what it entails.

LORD MAYOR: The Lord Mayor of Liverpool is known as the first citizen and is the chosen representative of the city, acting as a focal point for the community as well as promoting Liverpool and forging national and international links. The Lord Mayor of Liverpool is always a serving councillor, elected by the full city council at its Annual General Meeting which is held each May, and stands for one year in office.

The Lord Mayor's duties include:

- Representing the city at civic functions/ engagements
- Promoting the city nationally and internationally
- Supporting local charities and community groups
- Attending religious events of all denominations
- Meeting delegates from twinned cities
- Chairing meetings of the Full Council
- Conferring Honorary Freemen and Freedom of Associations and Institutions



LA VIDA: What are your aims and goals during your term?

LORD MAYOR: To promote Liverpool as a creative city and to regenerate youth provision for our young people.

LA VIDA: What charity initiatives are you championing?

LORD MAYOR: Liverpool Education Grants Charitable Trust; Liverpool Literacy Cycle; Youth Works Apprenticeships; Liverpool Poetry Space



LA VIDA: What do you love the most about Liverpool?

LORD MAYOR: The river, the buildings and of course our wonderful people so warm and welcoming.

LA VIDA: What do you think are the biggest challenges Liverpool faces?

LORD MAYOR: Reducing the number of people and children in particular living in poverty. Getting more people into better paid jobs. Having a well qualified work force.



LA VIDA: Tell us more about Liverpool Literacy Cycle and your role with that.

LORD MAYOR: The Liverpool Literacy Cycle started in January 2020 with a Year of Reading and since then has evolved into an annual reoccurring focus on one of the main literacy skills: reading, writing and spoken word. The Liverpool Literacy Cycle aims to upskill everyone, in schools and in our many varied communities because literacy skills are important human tools that can be rewarding at a personal creative level or crucial as the means to economic recovery.

Behind the cycle is a well-established network, connecting and creating collaboration between organisations, projects and free-lance creatives working to improve literacy skills in the city. The network is supported by a partner group of volunteers who meet monthly to co-ordinate, plan and promote literacy events.

All partners agree that more can be achieved together to improve the outcomes needed to upskill our workforce for better paid jobs. Throughout this time, the partner group has been committed to shared values, always striving to be inclusive by engaging with all our communities, especially as over 120 languages are now spoken in Liverpool.

The Liverpool Literacy Cycle is committed to developing local creative industries with paid opportunities for performers and writers, plus a longer-term aim to grow and sustain industries such as printing and publishing in the North West. There is great talent in the city and the region, and we need creatives working together and alongside each other to help literacy thrive for everyone.

LA VIDA: What is your message to the people of Liverpool?

LORD MAYOR: Join my campaign #ChainReaction – are you a link in the chain?

An Independent Financial Adviser from Wirral has brought home four Silver Medals at the World Transplant Games in Germany, following his five Gold Medals at the UK Transplant Games. Richard Jones, 46, has had his life saved three times through kidney transplants and now competes as a swimmer in the UK and World games for transplant survivors.



Many people in his Wirral hometown will recognise Richard as Director of Smart Independent Financial Advice Ltd — his financial advice practice that offers a friendly drop-in service. With over 20 years' experience, he is a trusted and respected local expert — specialising in inheritance tax planning, retirement planning, and estate planning including Wills and Lasting Powers of Attorney — however his latest achievements have made him the talk of the town for other reasons.



Two years ago, the father-of-four received a life-saving kidney transplant — his third one — this time from his sister, Lynsey Hockings, from Heswall, Wirral. "I'm incredibly thankful for each of my gifts, and fortunate that my third and final kidney has been successful with no return of the virus that damaged my previous kidney transplants — it has given me a normal, healthy life again."



Now, with renewed energy and focus, he trains with Hoylake Swimming Club and Liverpool City Masters, and is a member of the Transplant Sport Swimming Club. In 2024, he competed in the UK Transplant Games in Nottingham and brought home an incredible five gold medals in 200m Freestyle, 100m Freestyle, 100m Backstroke, 100m breaststroke and the Freestyle relay event.



Richard's stellar performance at the UK Transplant Games earned him a coveted place on Team GB for the World Transplant Games, held in Dresden, Germany, in August 2025. Competing against top transplant athletes from around the globe, he took part in seven events — and proudly brought home four silver medals in 50m Backstroke, 100m Backstroke, 200m Freestyle and the Relay Event.

The UK and World Transplant Games are about more than winning — they're powerful celebrations of life after illness. Every athlete is living proof of what organ donation makes possible. Recipients that have received a kidney, liver, heart or bone marrow can all compete and help promote the benefits of organ donation. They highlight what transplant recipients can achieve, both physically and mentally.

"It was an incredible honour to represent Team GB and compete alongside other transplant recipients from all over the world," says Richard. "Each of us has our own unique journey, but what unites us is gratitude –for our donors, and for the second chance we've been given."



On a day-to-day basis Richard Jones is a Chartered Independent Financial Adviser who gives people invaluable financial advice, yet behind the suit is a survivor who is truly grateful to be alive. He now not only competes internationally to help raise awareness, he is also about to become a trustee of the Wirral and West Cheshire Kidney Patient Association — a new charity in affiliation with the National Kidney Federation.

"The charity is run by kidney patients, for kidney patients," he explains. "We'll be providing financial support and practical equipment, but above all, we'll be offering a supportive community to help families through the challenges they face."



Richard's journey — from a life-threatening kidney disease to transplant recipient and international swimming success — is one of perseverance, gratitude and hope. With the support of his family, the gift of a working kidney and a determination to serve his community, Richard is a true example of how organ donation is one of the greatest gifts you can give.



I didn't mind using my wheelchair as it meant I could go to university and get on the train and do life as I wanted. But it was tough — we even had to move house for wheelchair accessibility."



Her first year in business has exceeded expectations, not just in terms of growth but in impact. Jacqui's story is an inspiring example of overcoming adversity, redefining limits and building something extraordinary in the face of a chronic condition that often forces people to scale back their ambitions. 

In a modest drop-in centre in Liverpool, one man is making a profound difference to the lives of those who have served their country. Craig Donoghue, 40, is a British Army veteran who has dedicated himself wholeheartedly to helping fellow veterans through his work with The Block Armed Forces Foundation.



Though officially employed part-time as a Case Manager, Craig's impact goes far beyond any job description or contracted hours. Over the past four years, Craig has poured countless voluntary hours into his work at The Block, becoming a vital support system for veterans in crisis.

Whether it's mental health support, helping secure financial aid, arranging addiction rehabilitation through Tom Harrison House or moving rough sleepers into accommodation, Craig is on the front lines every day — tackling some of the most harrowing and high-risk cases imaginable.



What makes his contribution even more extraordinary is that he does it all while managing his own chronic pain. Craig suffers from a serious back injury sustained during his time in service with the Royal Corps of Signals. The injury eventually led to his medical discharge.

Among his many roles in the Army, Craig completed a gruelling 7-month operational tour of Iraq — an experience that shaped his deep understanding of the challenges veterans face after leaving the military. Despite the toll on his body and spirit, Craig continues to show up — day after day — with compassion, determination and unwavering commitment.

The Block's Co-Founder, Colin Eastaway, said: "Despite his own physical struggles due to his injury, Craig continues to dig out for other veterans across The Liverpool City Region who are less fortunate than himself. He often leaves the centre physically and mentally exhausted, yet never lets that stop him from doing what needs to be done. His selflessness and grit have quite literally saved lives."

He continued: "As a drop in service we are currently overwhelmed with homeless veterans. On average, Craig meets face to face with around 2-3 complex homeless veteran cases a week and hundreds more have been given Mental Health Assessments after Craig has sat down with them, looked them in the eye and chatted veteran to veteran. Who knows how many lives this man has saved over the last few years and who knows how many families he has helped stay together."



The Block Armed Forces Foundation, which operates with very limited funding, provides vital support to veterans across Merseyside. Craig's dedication is one of the key reasons the organisation continues to make such a significant impact. He is not only a cornerstone of the charity's success — he is the beating heart of its mission.

To many, Craig Donoghue is an unsung hero who deserves more recognition. But to the veterans whose lives he has touched, he is a lifeline, a brother-in-arms and a true embodiment of what it means to continue serving — even after the uniform is folded away.

In February 2025, a powerful force for change emerged on the Wirral — Reverse North West CIC, a Community Interest Company founded to help women break free from the devastating impacts of domestic abuse. The Wallasey based organisation offers a wide range of free services and is ran by a team of volunteers that many describe simply as angels.

At its welcoming hub on Withens Lane, Wallasey, Reverse North West operates a free drop-in centre, open Monday to Friday from 9am to 3pm. With an open-door policy, women can walk in without judgment, without fear and without cost — a rarity in an overstretched and underfunded domestic abuse support system. The hub building has been kindly provided by Liscard Primary School.

Here, women who have been subject to domestic abuse — whether that be physical, sexual, mental, emotional or financial — can access a wide range of free services, from trauma-informed counselling and psychotherapy, to a range of wellbeing and healing treatments.

It's not just therapy — it's a holistic approach to rebuilding lives. The counselling at Reverse North West CIC is rooted in trauma-informed practice, which recognises the complex effects of abuse and prioritises safety, empowerment and trust. Whether a woman is seeking one-to-one counselling or group workshops, the environment is designed to help her regain her sense of safety, self-worth and autonomy.

Psychotherapy sessions offer deeper insights into how a person's thoughts, behaviours and emotions may be impacted by trauma, helping women make sense of their experiences and reclaim control of their futures. Reverse North West CIC also offers practical advise and signposting wherever necessary so that women know their options.

What makes Reverse North West CIC truly special is the people behind it. Run entirely by a dedicated team of volunteers, these are individuals who selflessly give their time, energy and compassion to make sure every woman who walks through their door feels seen, heard and supported. They don't do it for pay. They do it because they care.

At the heart of Reverse North West CIC is Eve Donnelly, who is living experience of domestic violence survival. Through years of healing and recovery, Eve has found her voice — and now uses it to speak to schools and organisations, helping others understand the realities of domestic violence and how to spot the signs. She has also created a new educational video for schools. Reverse North West CIC is her way of giving back — to offer other women the kind of support she wishes she had in those dark moments.

Every counselling session. Every healing treatment. Every drop-in conversation over a cup of tea — it's all free for the women who need it most. But this only continues to be possible through donations and community support. Reverse North West CIC is calling on individuals, local businesses and larger organisations to support their mission so that these life-changing (and often life-saving) services remain free and accessible.

Whether it's £5 or £500, every donation directly funds frontline support for women breaking free from abuse. Reverse North West isn't just a CIC. It's a sanctuary. A community. A lifeline. And behind it all? A team of volunteers who are, in every sense of the word, angels.




A brand-new men's mental health charity has launched in Wirral, aiming to tackle loneliness, isolation and the growing mental health crisis among local men. Mersey Mind Project is focused on early intervention and building a supportive community — offering many free services and activities.



The charity will host completely free drop-in sessions every Tuesday evening at The Sandbrook Centre in Moreton. Running from 6.30pm to 8pm, the sessions are designed to be informal and welcoming, giving local men a safe, non-judgemental space to chat, connect and unwind. Alongside conversation, attendees can enjoy free refreshments, board games and more.

The charity's mission is to grow a strong network of local men who can support one another through the ups and downs of life. Beyond the Tuesday dropins, the organisation is also running a variety of free activities to help boost wellbeing through social connection and physical exercise. These include:

- Free football sessions on Monday and Thursday evenings in Prenton
- Upcoming walk-and-talks and group hikes
- Free social events such as going out to watch live sport
- Cycletherapy' bike rides launching in spring



With suicide still one of the leading causes of death among men under 50 in the UK, the charity hopes that by creating regular opportunities to connect, more men will feel comfortable speaking openly about their mental health and seeking support before reaching crisis point. The charity also has a wider network of mental health experts and professionals, should any members require additional support.



The organisers encourage any local man who may be struggling — or simply looking for some positive social connection — to come along and give it a try. The weekly meet-ups on Tuesday are supported by Magenta Living, who have donated The Sandbrook Centre space without a hire charge, and the sessions are completely free to attend.

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

A brand-new Wirral-based Community Interest Company (CIC) is now offering child mental health support groups after its successful launch event that raised over £2,500. Tiny Tools For Big Feelings, founded by child mental health expert Carly Openshaw, is on a mission to help children, young people and families navigate the growing mental health crisis.

The CIC offers six-week programmes for children aged 6+, providing tools to manage anxiety, grief and neurodivergent conditions. Sessions are available 1-2-1 or in groups, with group courses currently priced at just £70 for the entire course. Thanks to the successful launch event, these programmes are currently fully funded and free to families.

On Saturday 4th October 2025, The Queen's Hotel in New Brighton was filled with laughter, music and heartfelt emotion as over 80 guests came together for the launch of Tiny Tools for Big Feelings CIC. The night was a huge success, raising £2,504.90 after costs. These funds will directly support more than 60 local children and young people to access anxiety and wellbeing programmes across Wirral and Merseyside.

Within days, Tiny Tools For Big Feelings has already begun delivering its first funded courses. Two anxiety-support groups for ages 5–10 and 11–18 welcomed children struggling with anxiety, school refusal and neurodiverse needs. There are now plans to create more support groups for children and parents alike.

Alongside children's services, Tiny Tools For Big Feelings also provides family support and parentfocused courses, ensuring that caregivers are equipped with the strategies they need too. Led by a team of experts, Tiny Tools For Big Feelings is dedicated to creating real change for children, overwhelmed families, carers and neurodivergent young people.

With 1 in 6 children between 5 and 15 suffering from some sort of mental health disorder, families stretched and the NHS child mental health waiting list over 12 months, the new CIC is bridging the gap in a major way. Any parents or care givers struggling with the pressures of child mental health problems are encouraged to get in touch free of charge to see what help is available.

Welcome to our quarterly feature from our resident life coach, Linda B! Linda B is a leading international life coach from Iceland and is a LET Communication Consultant, Trauma Resiliency Model expert, Former President of the Icelandic Coaching Federation and Board of Icelandic Women's Business Association.

To feel unacknowledged in our society or by those who should love us the most, cuts the heart in a way nothing else can. To feel that we are not good enough or important enough for those to whom we offer our hearts on a silver platter is painful, and we can feel our hearts being crushed beneath the tidal wave of rejection.

Rejection can come from anyone, society, the workplace, family, friends, or a partner and nowhere does it hurt more than when it comes from those we are bonded to through love in one way or another. Those who experienced rejection or uncertainty about their place early in life are likely to spend much of their adulthood seeking approval from the people they connect with.



With every inevitable rejection they meet along the way, their hearts may harden or grow more wounded until the day comes when they stop giving anyone the chance to hurt them again. And then, they reach to the point of rejecting their own need for love and care.

It is very common for those of us who have been single for some time to have gone through a number of rejections from the opposite sex. These rejections have caused some of us to stop taking the risk of loving at all and I believe that very often, it is our inner fear of rejection that drives that decision. We find endless escape routes to avoid feeling emotional pain:

- Our primary escape route, in love and in all relationships, is simply not giving anyone the chance to get close enough to reject us. As soon as we feel a relationship becoming too intimate, we're quick to run.
- Another escape route is closing our hearts completely, letting no one in, growing hardened and bitter.

Both of these strategies are disastrous and they dramatically reduce the quality of our lives.

- First of all, life simply does not offer us the luxury of having everyone liking us. We will face rejection and there's nothing to be done about that, and it says nothing about our own worth. And we should never allow it to define us in any way. For example, it does not diminish the beauty or qualities of Brad Pitt if I personally would rather go on a date with George Clooney! Brad just might not be my type, it's as simple as that.
- Secondly, when we are searching for intimate connection, it is quite clear that we need to kiss a few frogs before we find the prince or princess of our dreams. Are we truly willing to let a few rejections or frogs who refused to transform, destroy our search for the moments of joy and happiness in the company of the right person? A person who respects, loves, and cherishes us?



Are we willing to spend our lives alone and abandoned because a few individuals did not see that we were a match for them? (Out of 8 billion people) If we look beyond our love life for a moment, the world would be poorer today if those who gave us magnificent stories and discoveries had given up because of early rejections from the society, colleagues, or friends.

 Do you know how many publishers rejected the story of Harry Potter? Not one or two, but 12 publishers who saw no potential in this magical story about a the young wizard. And yet, one publisher finally saw what others had missed and the story went on to conquer the world and bring unimaginable success to its creator.

- KFC would not exist today if Colonel Sanders had given up on sharing his recipe. He travelled across the entire United States chasing the opportunity that would eventually feed millions of people around the world. His determination changed everything.
- Charles Darwin was around fifty years old when he finally received recognition for his work. I would love to know how many rejections he faced, and how many people actually thought he was mad.



I could go on listing names of people who stood up again and again despite rejection until they finally succeeded. So let's not give up and never allow a few rejections to define us as people or as active creators in our own lives. I know that when I reject something or someone, it is simply because the person, project, or job doesn't fit my life's definition or my life pattern. Nothing more. Full stop.

And although all of this sounds simple, it does not mean we don't feel pain when we are rejected. We are human, after all and rejection often makes us question our worth. And who wants to question their own worth?

Today I am fully aware of my value, and I know



I deserve only the very best and nothing less. If someone rejects me, then that person, workplace, or friendship was simply not meant to be part of my life. But I continue walking forward and create new opportunities for myself.

Because I believe wholeheartedly that people and circumstances enter our lives with a purpose, even from those who reject us. Some bring them tough but essential lessons. Some stay only briefly but leave important wisdom behind. And then there are the diamonds, those who remain with us through all seasons of life, teaching us about goodness, loyalty, and grace.

So let us thank those who rejected us, my loves, they most likely brought us the most valuable lessons. They showed us our insecurity and taught us what we needed to learn, change, and strengthen. Let us simply remember: Never allow yourself to close your heart.



In my opinion, that is not an option if we want a joyful and meaningful life. What gives life its true value is the giving and receiving of love, friendship, and all the beautiful human connections available to us at any given time. And that happens only in an open and willing heart, ready to let the beauty of the inside flow outward.

Few things are a greater poverty than losing the ability to show what lives really is at the core of our being and missing the joy that comes from allowing ourselves to be vulnerable and to love with our whole heart. Let's love, give, and enjoy each day in gratitude for those who didn't reject us, and who remain by our side. And as Oprah says: "I no longer want anyone who doesn't want me."

What is meant for me in love, friendship, and work will show up at right time and right season, and I will recognize it with my heart when it arrives.

As always, I am just one appointment away from you if you need my guidance on your life journey.

In this regular La Vida Liverpool feature, guest writer and historian David Hearn educates us on some fascinating local history. With a wealth of knowledge, David gives talks and walking tours on subjects such as the history of Liverpool, wars, slavery, maritime, Liverpool's links with America and more. In this feature he talks us through the Wirral gem that is Hamilton Sqauare....



There are a number of places on the Wirral that can rightfully be referred to as "gems" and surely one of those has to be Hamilton Square in Birkenhead, a square that would not look out of space in any of the smarter areas of London or Edinburgh. Indeed, the square was designed by James Gillespie Graham — the Edinburgh architect who designed St Andrew's Cathedral in Glasgow and elements of Edinburgh's New Town.

Hamilton Square was envisaged by William Laird as the first step in the creation of an important and sophisticated town centre for Birkenhead. The name, Hamilton, comes from the maiden name of his mother in law and his wife's brother William Hamilton who was one of Laird's business partners



In Hamilton Square there are 61 properties listed by Historic England as Grade I — the highest level of rating meaning that they are "of exceptional interest". Only Trafalgar Square in London has more Grade I Listed Buildings.

When the square was laid out a space was intentionally left on the East side for Birkenhead's Town Hall to be built. Although work started on Hamilton Square in 1825 it would not be until 1883 that work started on the Town Hall. The Town hall is a fitting addition to the square and is, itself, listed Grade II* meaning that it is a "particularly important building of more than special interest".



Hamilton Square is also home to both Lionel Budden's First World War Grade II* Listed memorial which is 100 years old this year and the dramatic modern war memorial created by Jim Whelan dedicated to the 88 "Old Boys" of Birkenhead Institute who died in the First World War.



In the centre of the square is a memorial to Queen Victoria designed by Edmund Kirby in the style of an Eleanor Cross and unveiled in 1905 just two years after the gardens were bought by the council from the owners of the properties who previously enjoyed them as a private garden.



It is fitting that there is a statue to John Laird, first Member of Parliament for Birkenhead and the owner of 63 Hamilton Square, on the West side of the square. The square has many other memorials and it is a fitting place for them with its many trees, shrubs and a general air of calm.



Built in 1886 and on the edge of Hamilton Square is the station that takes its name from the square and was one of the first two – James Street being the other – that were the first deep underground stations in the world and the first two stations linked by a railway tunnel under a river.



The building of Hamilton Square was started 200 years ago this year and has the solid appearance of properties that will last another 200 years, although there are some empty properties it is difficult to see that these will reman empty for long if they came on the market.

At 35, Chester-based hormone and mindset coach Laura Teare has become a powerful voice for women navigating the often-overlooked world of hormonal health. In addition to helping women understand and manage hormonal challenges, Laura is also the founder of the rapidly growing GET **IT DONE CLUB — a fun, relaxed networking and co-working concept.

After years of battling Premenstrual Dysphoric Disorder (PMDD), Laura now mentors women through hormonal struggles and has helped improve the lives of hundreds of women. Going one step further, she founded GET **IT DONE CLUB in 2023 — organising relaxed and informal business meet-ups across Wirral, Liverpool, Chester and Wrexham. Her achievements are remarkable given her journey with PMDD....

Laura's journey with Premenstrual Dysphoric Disorder began long before she had the language to describe it. She had her first period at 14, and while her cycle appeared "normal" on the surface, the emotional landscape was anything but.

From her early teens, Laura experienced intense depressive phases that came and went with rhythmic regularity — though she didn't yet know they were linked to her menstrual cycle. The feelings were overwhelming, cyclic, and frightening. Instead of receiving answers, she received dismissal.

At 15, while seeking help for what she now recognises as cyclical disordered eating, she was simply handed a leaflet about healthy foods. She internalised the shame, believing she was the problem — not her hormones.

For the next 14 years, the pattern repeated. Each month brought crushing lows, self-blame and confusion. "I punished myself with unhealthy behaviours," Laura reflects. "I blamed myself for not being able to 'fix' something I didn't understand."

Everything changed at age 28 when Laura stumbled upon a social media post describing PMDD. It was a moment of revelation. With years of mood-tracking notebooks already in hand, she recognised the cyclical nature of her symptoms immediately.

She began tracking her menstrual cycle alongside her

moods and took her findings to her GP. After ruling out other health issues, she finally received a formal diagnosis. "There's no cure for PMDD," Laura says, "but with the right treatment, I've found a way to live more fully than ever before."

Diagnosis wasn't the end of the journey — it was the beginning of learning how to manage a misunderstood condition. Initial treatment recommendations weren't right for her and finding an effective plan took time and persistence. Laura now uses luteal-phase dosing of SSRIs, alongside deep self-awareness and compassionate self-care, to manage her condition.

Rather than let PMDD define her, Laura has channelled her experience into supporting others. Today, she coaches women through a wide range of hormonal issues, blending education, empathy and lived experience. Her support, advice and strategies have helped hundreds of women feel seen and heard — also equipping them with practical tools and advice to manage their conditions.

Meanwhile, her GET **IT DONE CLUB is a vibrant, community-driven networking and co-working organisation designed for people who want to build businesses, confidence and connections without the pressure or pretension of traditional corporate environments. What started as an idea to help connect lonely business owners now sees hundreds of people meet up each month.

Through her work, her honesty and her unshakeable commitment to women's wellbeing, Laura Teare is turning her hardest battles into a lifeline for others — proving that even through the most challenging adversities, empowerment and success can still be achieved.

When Wirral mother Louise Lynch founded The Relaxed Mama Club in 2020, her vision was clear — to create a nurturing space where women could feel supported, seen and empowered through one of life's biggest transitions: motherhood. Since then, she has helped hundreds of women navigate the emotional, physical and mental challenges that come with pregnancy, birth and life beyond.

Louise's approach is holistic and deeply personal. As a yoga teacher, cognitive behavioural hypnotherapist and mother of two, she draws on her own experiences of motherhood to guide women with compassion and understanding. Her services include counselling, pregnancy yoga, hypnobirthing, workshops and retreats — all designed to help women reconnect with their bodies and regain balance in their lives.

Introducing Birth Debriefing — Healing After Birth

Louise's newest offering, Birth Debriefing, addresses a growing but often overlooked need among mothers. For many, birth can be a profoundly emotional — and sometimes traumatic — experience. One in five mothers are diagnosed with postnatal depression, yet countless others struggle quietly with anxiety, nervous system dysregulation or a sense of loss after childbirth.

With the NHS under increasing pressure, many new mothers find themselves without the time or space to process what they've been through. Louise's Birth Debriefing sessions bridge that gap. In a safe, supportive environment, she helps women unpack their birth experiences, make sense of their emotions, and begin to heal. The process allows mothers not only to come to terms with their experiences but also to move forward with renewed confidence and calm as they navigate early motherhood.

A Personal Journey Turned Professional Passion

Louise began her yoga journey in 2018, later tailoring her practice to reflect her own path into parenthood. She is now a qualified Pre- and Postnatal Yoga, Children's Yoga and Fertility Yoga specialist, as well as a Cognitive Behavioural Hypnotherapist (Dip CBH), Hypnobirthing Practitioner (Dip HB) and qualified teacher.

Her multidisciplinary expertise allows her to combine the physical benefits of yoga, the mindset tools of hypnotherapy and the emotional support of counselling — a blend that helps women thrive rather than just survive their journey into motherhood. Whether she's working with a woman going through pregnancy or a new mother post-pregnancy, she tailors sessions to suit the individual.

Community, Connection and Conversation

Beyond her one-to-one work, Louise has built a strong online and community presence. Her popular podcast resonates deeply with mothers who appreciate her honesty, empathy and evidence-based approach to maternal wellbeing. Each episode explores real-life motherhood — the highs, the lows, and everything in between — creating a space for women to feel less alone.

Supporting Mothers to Feel Whole Again

Motherhood is often described as beautiful, but it can also be bewildering and overwhelming. Through The Relaxed Mama Club, Louise reminds women that it's okay to seek support, to pause and to reconnect with themselves. Her mission is simple but powerful: to help mothers feel relaxed, resilient and ready to embrace each stage of their journey.



In just one year, Soul Space has blossomed into one of Chester's most loved wellbeing hubs — with over 100 people through the doors every week. The centre offers classes seven days a week and caters to all levels and preferences. The timetable features a wide range of styles and these thoughtfully curated offerings reflect Mo's belief that yoga should be accessible, varied and welcoming to all.

More Than a Yoga Studio

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
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Standing under the sweltering sun of Katsina, northern Nigeria, Luke Leyland's hand gripped the kara tape bound around his hand — a hard rope which is said to turn a Dambe warrior's fist into a weapon. He stood in anticipation, cheers erupting from the crowds of spectators as drums echoed in the air. In this moment, Leyland became not only a fighter, but a trailblazing pioneer for Westerners in the Dambe martial art.



Leyland, 38, an avid martial artist from Birkenhead, became the first ever white Westerner to have competed in Dambe — a Hausa martial art which originated around the 10th century. Traditionally practiced by butchers and fishermen around harvest time when exchanging meat and fish, there would be a festival followed by a fight as a trial of courage.

Dambe later became a warfare technique and sometimes a test before marriage. The sport levels as a traditional style of boxing which incorporates traditional and cultural rituals such as Juju. Dambe fights last a maximum of three rounds and the aim is to land a brutal blow that knocks the opponent to the floor through a hard punch or kick.



Despite Leyland having taken part in taekwondo in his youth and having been a professional wrestler for around four years in his early 20s, his Dambe bout was the first time he had competed in a boxing contest. Curious about finding the right martial art for him, he found the sport on YouTube.

Luke explained: "When I first came across Dambe I thought it was a scene out of an action movie. I remember thinking that if it was possible for me to take part in it, it would be an amazing journey to share the sport with the rest of the world."



Indeed, his journey was never just about fighting — it was about breaking barriers, earning respect and showcasing a sport that had initially remained largely unknown outside West Africa. Training for Dambe was very difficult, as there were no established training centres for the sport outside Nigeria — he had to train in the UK, creating and adapting a training and sparring routine to prepare for the fight under a "great" coach called Kallum Paul.



When Luke arrived in Katsina, he was only able to procure one or two training sessions with the Dambe coach in Katsina due to the overwhelming media attention. That said, Dambe warriors are known for their agility and explosive powerful hits, as well as intense mental fortitude, so amount of preparation could have primed Leyland to step into the hot sand against a seasoned Dambe fighter.

Luke said: "I learnt there was no actual way I could have prepared for this in the UK as the sand in the arena was completely different and my opponent, Shagon Yellow, seemed to move his feet through the sand so quickly and easily like a shark in water. I just had to grit my teeth and try my best. Shagon defeated me in a fair Dambe fight and I have all the respect in the world for him and this sport."

In the introduction to the fight, Leyland was introduced as 'Dan Bature Kudawa', loosely translated as the 'White Man of House Kudu'. This fighting title later became the title to Leyland's documentary on Dambe, which was officially selected for the AFRIFF film festival (the biggest film festival in Africa). He is currently preparing to release the documentary in the UK and is searching for a channel to release it on.

Despite his ultimate loss in the Dambe match, Luke was surprised by spectators. On his arrival, many were shocked by his participation in Dambe, with some being sceptical of his intentions. However, by the end, thousands cheered him on, with fans wanting pictures and chanting his name.



On a live phone-in TV show, more than 380 people waited to connect with him, with fans in Katsina, Kano and even in the airport supporting and wanting to meet him. "I understood that I had done something amazing for the sport. Even though I had lost the fight, I had won the hearts of the people," he reflected.



Luke had arrived in Nigeria with little knowledge of what to expect and with many odds stacked against him. On arrival he realised his bag — and malaria medication — were missing. The fear of contracting malaria, which could be fatal if caught, was compounded with dehydration and the inability to connect with people due to initial miscommunications.

However, the knowledge of how historic his Dambe bout was fortified his will. He explained: "In the heat of any battle — physical or mental — a martial artist must stay calm. Control over the mind is the key to mastering any challenge."



Before his fight, Dambe was a sport that largely remained confined to its Hausa roots, being practiced only within Nigeria and neighbouring states in Africa. Though its popularity had been rapidly growing, gaining millions of views online, Luke's participation has opened the floodgates to a wave of new overseas Dambe fighters, with combatants from Poland, Algeria and Russia having begun to compete.

This is the story of how a man from Birkenhead stepped into the unknown and changed a sport forever. This is the story of 'Dan Bature Kudawa'. Luke summarised: "The whole experience was amazing and I am extremely proud to say that the first white Western Dambe fighter came from Birkenhead".
